GENERAL RISKS

General

It is intended that the Issuer will invest in securities and other financial assets with certain risk characteristics as described below and subject to the restrictions described below. There can be no assurance that the Issuer's investments will be successful, and that the holders of Notes will receive the full amounts payable by the Issuer under the Notes or that they will receive any return on their investment in the Notes. Prospective investors are therefore advised to review this entire Listing Particulars carefully and should consider, among other things, the factors set out below before deciding whether to invest in the Notes.

Suitability

Prospective purchasers of the Notes of any Class should ensure that they understand the nature of such Notes and the extent of their exposure to risk, that they have sufficient knowledge, experience and access to professional advisers to make their own legal, tax, accounting and financial evaluation of the merits and risks of investment in such Notes and that they consider the suitability of such Notes as an investment in the light of their own circumstances and financial condition.

RISKS SPECIFIC TO THE ISSUER AND ITS INDUSTRY

Set out below is a brief description of certain risks relating to the Issuer and its sole purpose of issuing Notes:

Credit Risk

The ability of the Issuer to meet its payment obligations under the Notes will be adversely affected by defaults in the underlying Secured Assets. The Issuer is inherently exposed to risks arising from changes in credit quality and the recoverability of Secured Assets. Increased numbers of defaults by Borrowers or other obligors of Secured Assets may reduce the recoverability and value of the Issuer's assets.

Security May Be Declared Invalid

The Issuer will, for each Series, grant security interests in favour of the Trustee for the benefit of the Noteholders in the Issuer Security pursuant to the Trust Deed and the Issuer Deed of Charge. However, if the security interest of the Trustee in the Issuer Security was determined to be invalid or unperfected, Noteholders in such Series would be unsecured creditors and would rank on a pari passu basis with other unsecured creditors (if any) of the Issuer. Each of the foregoing factors may

delay or reduce investors' return on their Notes and investors may suffer a loss (including a total loss) on their investment.

Limited Sources of Funds to pay Expenses of the Issuer

The funds available to the Issuer to pay its expenses on any Interest Payment Date are limited as provided in the Conditions. In the event that such funds are not sufficient to pay the expenses incurred by the Issuer, the ability of the Issuer to operate effectively may be impaired, and it may not be able to defend or prosecute legal proceedings brought against it or which it might otherwise bring to protect its interests or pay the expenses of legal proceedings brought against persons whom the Issuer has indemnified.

In the event of non-payment under the Secured Assets, there is no assurance that the Issuer will have the ability to pay interest on the Notes or, on the redemption date of Notes (whether on the respective Maturity Dates or Longstop Maturity Dates (as applicable) for each series of Notes, upon acceleration or upon mandatory early redemption in part or in whole as permitted under the Notes), that there will be sufficient funds to enable the Issuer to repay principal in respect of such Series of Notes in whole or in part.

If the Secured Assets do not generate sufficient funds for the Issuer to pay the Notes in full on a Maturity Date or Longstop Maturity Date (as applicable) for a Series of Notes, then the Issuer will not be obliged to pay the shortfall between the amount expected to be paid on the Maturity Date or Longstop Maturity Date (as applicable) and the amount that can be repaid from the Secured Assets, and any claims in respect of such shortfall will be extinguished, so that Noteholders may lose all or part of their investment.

Nature of the Issuer

The Issuer is a newly formed entity and has no operating history. The Issuer will have no material assets other than the Issuer Security. The Issuer will not engage in any business activity other than entering into the Transaction Documents, the issuance of the Notes, the acquisition and disposition of and investment and reinvestment in Secured Assets and cash or cash equivalents as described herein, certain activities conducted in connection with the payment of amounts in respect of the Notes and the management of the Issuer Security, and other activities incidental or related to the foregoing. Income derived from the Secured Assets will be the Issuer's principal source of cash.

Noteholders Have No Direct Recourse to Secured Assets

No proprietary or other direct interest in the Issuer's rights under or in respect of any Secured Assets or any related partial financial guarantee in respect of the Secured Assets backing that Series exists for the benefit of the Noteholders. Subject to the terms of the Trust Deed, no Noteholder will have any entitlement to enforce any of the provisions of the corresponding Secured Assets or have direct recourse to the corresponding obligor of such Secured Assets except through action by the Trustee under the Trust Deed and the Issuer Deed of Charge.

Not Intended as a Complete Investment Program

Because of its specialised objective, the Issuer will not generally invest in assets as diversified as other investment vehicles. Accordingly, the Issuer's investments may be subject to more rapid change in value than would be the case if the Issuer were required to maintain diversification among types of securities and other instruments and countries and industries.

Liability for the Notes

The Notes are secured obligations of the Issuer only and do not establish any liability or other obligation of any other person mentioned in this Listing Particulars including but not limited to the Trustee, the Paying Agent, the Registrar, the Servicer or the Calculation Agent. None of the

foregoing or any other person has assumed or will assume any obligation in the event the Issuer fails to make any payment due under any of the Notes.

Limited Recourse Nature of the Notes

In accordance with the provisions of the Trust Deed, the Notes will be direct limited recourse obligations solely of the Issuer, and the Noteholders will therefore have a claim under the Notes against the Issuer only to the extent of the Issuer Security associated with that Series. The Notes constitute secured obligations of the Issuer. If there are insufficient funds available to the Issuer to pay in full all principal, interest and other amounts due in respect of the Notes at the Maturity Date or Longstop Maturity Date (as applicable) or upon acceleration or upon mandatory early redemption in part or in whole as permitted under the Notes, then the investors will have no further claim against the Issuer in respect of any such unpaid amounts. No recourse may be had for any amount due in respect of any Notes or any other obligations of the Issuer against any officer, member, director, employee, shareholder or incorporator of the Issuer or their respective successors or assigns. Each of the parties to the Transaction Documents (other than the Issuer) covenants and agrees that it shall not be entitled to petition or take any step for the winding-up of the Issuer for so long as any Notes of the Issuer are outstanding.

RISKS RELATED TO THE STRUCTURE OF A PARTICULAR ISSUE OF NOTES

Fixed Rate Notes, Floating Rate Notes and Zero Coupon Notes may be issued under the Programme. A number of these Notes may have features which contain particular risks for potential investors. Set out below is a description of certain such features:

Notes subject to optional redemption by the Issuer

An optional redemption feature is likely to limit the market value of Notes. During any period when the Issuer may elect to redeem Notes, the market value of those Notes generally will not rise substantially above the price at which they can be redeemed. This also may be true prior to any redemption period.

The Issuer may be expected to redeem Notes when the cost of borrowing is lower than the interest rate on the Notes. At those times, an investor generally would not be able to reinvest the redemption proceeds at an effective interest rate as high as the interest rate on the Notes being redeemed and may only be able to do so at a significantly lower rate. Potential investors should consider reinvestment risk in light of other investments available at that time.

Fixed/Floating Rate Notes

Fixed/Floating Rate Notes may bear interest at a rate that the Issuer may elect to convert from a fixed rate to a floating rate or from a floating rate to a fixed rate. The Issuer's ability to convert the interest rate will affect the secondary market and the market value of such Notes since the Issuer may be expected to convert the rate when it is likely to produce a lower overall cost of borrowing. If the Issuer converts from a fixed rate to a floating rate, the spread on the Fixed/Floating Rate Notes may be less favourable than then prevailing spreads on comparable Floating Rate Notes tied to the same reference rate. In addition, the new floating rate at any time may be lower than the rates on other Notes. If the Issuer converts from a floating rate to a fixed rate, the fixed rate may be lower than the prevailing rates on its Notes.

Risks relating to Floating Rate Notes

The performance of floating interest rates is dependent upon a number of factors, including supply and demand on the international money markets, which are influenced by measures taken by governments and central banks, as well as speculations and other macroeconomic factors. The interest amount payable over the term of the Notes may vary and any of these factors could affect the performance of the floating interest rate and therefore could adversely affect the value and return on Floating Rate Notes.

Notes issued at a substantial discount or premium

The market values of securities issued at a substantial discount (such as Zero-Coupon Notes) or premium to their nominal amount tend to fluctuate more in relation to general changes in interest rates than do prices for conventional interest-bearing securities. Generally, the longer the remaining term of the securities, the greater the price volatility as compared to conventional interest-bearing securities with comparable maturities.

RISKS RELATING TO NOTES GENERALLY

Set out below is a brief description of certain risks relating to the Notes generally:

The Notes are not protected by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme

Unlike a bank deposit, the Notes are not protected by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme (the "FSCS") or any other government savings or deposit protection scheme. As a result, the FSCS will not pay compensation to an investor in the Notes upon the failure of the Issuer. If the Issuer goes out of business or becomes insolvent, Noteholders may lose all or part of their investment in the Notes.

No Regulation of the Issuer by any Regulatory Authority

The Issuer is not licensed or authorised under any current securities, commodities, insurance or banking laws of any jurisdiction and has not applied (and does not expect to apply) for any such licences or authorisations. There is no assurance, however, that regulatory authorities in one or more jurisdictions would not take a contrary view regarding the applicability of any such laws to the Issuer. The taking of a contrary view by any such regulatory authority could have an adverse impact on the Issuer or the holders of Notes issued by the Issuer.

Modification, waiver and substitution

The Conditions of the Notes contain provisions for calling meetings of Noteholders to consider matters affecting their interests generally. These provisions permit defined majorities to bind all Noteholders including Noteholders who did not attend and vote at the relevant meeting and Noteholders who voted in a manner contrary to the majority.

The Conditions of the Notes also provide that the Trustee may, without the consent of the Noteholders, agree to (a) any modification of any of the provisions of the Trust Deed or the Conditions of the Notes that is of a formal, minor or technical nature or is made to correct a manifest error, (b) any other modification (except as mentioned in the Trust Deed), and any waiver or authorisation of any breach or proposed breach, of any of the provisions of the Notes or Trust Deed that is in the opinion of the Trustee not materially prejudicial to the interests of the Noteholders, or (c) the substitution of another company as principal debtor under any Notes in place of the Issuer, in the circumstances described in Condition 16(c) (Substitution) of the Notes.

Taxation

Prospective investors and sellers of the Notes should be aware that they may be required to pay taxes or other documentary charges or duties in accordance with the laws and practices of the country where the Notes are transferred or other jurisdictions. Potential investors are advised not to rely upon the description contained in the general description section of this Listing Particulars but to ask for their own tax adviser's advice on their individual taxation with respect to the acquisition, sale and redemption of the Notes. Only these advisors are in a position to duly consider the specific situation of the prospective investor. This investment consideration has to be read in connection with the taxation sections of this Listing Particulars.

U.S. Foreign Account Tax Compliance Withholding

Pursuant to certain provisions of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986, commonly known as FATCA, a "foreign financial institution" may be required to withhold on certain payments it makes ("foreign passthru payments") to persons that fail to meet certain certification, reporting, or related requirements. The Company is a foreign financial institution for these purposes. A number of jurisdictions (including the United Kingdom) have entered into, or have agreed in substance to, intergovernmental agreements with the United States to implement FATCA ("IGAs"), which modify the way in which FATCA applies in their jurisdictions. Certain aspects of the application of the FATCA provisions and IGAs to instruments such as the Notes, including whether withholding would ever be required pursuant to FATCA or an IGA with respect to payments on instruments such as the Notes, are uncertain and may be subject to change.

Even if withholding would be required pursuant to FATCA or an IGA with respect to payments on instruments such as the Notes, under proposed U.S. Treasury regulations such withholding would not apply prior to the date that is two years after the date on which final regulations defining foreign passthru payments are published in the U.S. Federal Register, and Notes characterised as debt (or which are not otherwise characterised as equity and have a fixed term) for U.S. federal tax purposes that are issued on or prior to the date that is six months after the date on which final regulations defining "foreign passthru payments" are filed with the U.S. Federal 60 Register generally would be "grandfathered" for purposes of FATCA withholding unless materially modified after such date. In the preamble to the proposed regulations, the U.S. Treasury Department indicated that taxpayers may rely on these proposed regulations until the issuance of final regulations. However, if additional notes (as described under "Terms and Conditions of the Notes — Further Issues") that are not distinguishable from previously issued Notes are issued after the expiration of the grandfathering period and are subject to withholding under FATCA, then withholding agents may treat all Notes, including the Notes offered prior to the expiration of the grandfathering period, as subject to withholding under FATCA. In the event any withholding would be required pursuant to FATCA or an IGA with respect to payments on the Notes, no person will be required to pay additional amounts as a result of the withholding. Noteholders should consult their own tax advisors regarding how these rules may apply to their investment in the Notes.

Information reporting obligations

Information relating to the Notes, their holders and beneficial owners may be required to be provided to tax authorities in certain circumstances pursuant to domestic or international reporting and transparency regimes. This may include (but is not limited to) information relating to the value of the Notes, amounts paid or credited with respect to the Notes, details of the holders or beneficial owners of the Notes and information and documents in connection with transactions relating to the Notes. In certain circumstances, the information obtained by a tax authority may be provided to tax authorities in other countries. Some jurisdictions operate a withholding system in place of, or in addition to, such provision of information requirements.

Change of law

The Conditions of the Notes are based on English law in effect as at the date of issue of the relevant Notes. No assurance can be given as to the impact of any possible judicial decision or change to English law or administrative practice after the date of issue of the relevant Notes.

Notes where denominations involve integral multiples: definitive Notes

In relation to any issue of Notes which have denominations consisting of a minimum Specified Denomination plus one or more higher integral multiples of another smaller amount, it is possible that such Notes may be traded in amounts that are not integral multiples of such minimum Specified Denomination. In such a case a holder who, as a result of trading such amounts, holds an amount which is less than the minimum Specified Denomination in his account with the relevant clearing system at the relevant time may not receive a definitive Note in respect of such holding (should such definitive Notes be printed) and would need to purchase a principal amount of Notes such that its holding amounts to a Specified Denomination.

If definitive Notes are issued, holders should be aware that definitive Notes which have a denomination that is not an integral multiple of the minimum Specified Denomination may be illiquid and difficult to trade.

Risks relating to holding CREST Depositary Interests

Terms used in this risk factor and not otherwise defined shall have the meanings given to such terms in "Book-Entry Clearing Systems – Crest Depositary Interests".

CREST Depositary Interests are separate legal obligations distinct from the Notes and CDI Holders will be subject to additional provisions other than the Conditions of the Notes.

CDI Holders will hold or have an interest in a separate legal instrument and not be the legal owners of the Notes. The rights of CDI Holders to the Notes are represented by the relevant entitlements against the CREST Depository which (through the CREST Nominee) holds interests in the Notes. Accordingly, rights under the Notes cannot be enforced by CDI Holders except indirectly through the intermediary depositaries and custodians. The enforcement of rights under the Notes will be subject to the local law of the relevant intermediaries. This could result in an elimination or reduction in the payments that otherwise would have been made in respect of the Notes in the event of any insolvency or liquidation of any of the relevant intermediaries, in particular where the Notes held in clearing systems are not held in special purpose accounts and are fungible with other securities held in the same accounts on behalf of other customers of the relevant intermediaries.

The rights of the CDI Holders will be governed by the arrangements between CREST, Euroclear, Clearstream, Luxembourg and the relevant Issuer, including the CREST Deed Poll. Potential investors should note that the provisions of the CREST Deed Poll, the CREST Manual and the CREST Rules contain indemnities, warranties, representations and undertakings to be given by CDI Holders and limitations on the liability of the CREST Depository. CDI Holders are bound by such provisions and may incur liabilities resulting from a breach of any such indemnities, warranties, representations and undertakings in excess of the amounts originally invested by them. As a result, the rights of, and returns received by, CDI Holders may differ from those of holders of Notes which are not represented by CDIs.

In addition, CDI Holders may be required to pay fees, charges, costs and expenses to the CREST Depository in connection with the use of the CREST International Settlement Links Service. These will include the fees and expenses charged by the CREST Depository in respect of the provision of services by it under the CREST Deed Poll and any taxes, duties, charges, costs or expenses which may be or become payable in connection with the holding of the Notes through the CREST International Settlement Links Service.

Potential investors should note that none of the Issuer, the Settlement Agent, the relevant Promoter, the Trustee and the Paying Agents will have any responsibility for the performance by

any intermediaries or their respective direct or indirect participants or accountholders of their respective obligations under the rules and procedures governing their operations.

For further information on the issue and holding of CDIs see the section entitled "Book-Entry Clearing Systems – Crest Depositary Interests" in this Listing Particulars.

RISKS RELATED TO THE MARKET GENERALLY

Set out below is a brief description of the principal market risks, including liquidity risk, exchange rate risk, interest rate risk and credit risk:

Lower than expected volumes of issuance

No assurance is provided that investors will subscribe for the full amount of Notes which are made available for subscription during a particular offer period. The volume of issuance of a particular Tranche of Notes will depend on a number of factors including, without limitation, prevailing market conditions and the availability of alternative investment opportunities. To the extent that the volumes of issuance of the Notes are lower than expected, the liquidity of the Notes in the secondary market will be limited.

The secondary market generally

Notes may have no established trading market when issued, and one may never develop. If a market does develop, it may not be liquid. Therefore, investors may not be able to sell their Notes easily or at prices that will provide them with a yield comparable to similar investments that have a developed secondary market. This is particularly the case for Notes that are especially sensitive to interest rate, currency or market risks, are designed for specific investment objectives or strategies or have been structured to meet the investment requirements of limited categories of investors. These types of Notes generally would have a more limited secondary market and more price volatility than conventional debt securities. Illiquidity may have a severely adverse effect on the market value of Notes.

Further, if an investor chooses to sell its Notes in the open market at any time prior to maturity of the Notes, the price the investor will receive from a purchaser may be less than its original investment, and may be less than the amount due to be repaid at maturity of the Notes if the investor were to hold onto the Notes until then. Factors that will influence the price received by investors who choose to sell their Notes in the open market may include, but are not limited to, market appetite, inflation, the period remaining to maturity of the Notes, prevailing interest rates and the financial position of the Issuer.

Exchange rate risks and exchange controls

The Issuer will pay principal and interest on the Notes in the Specified Currency specified in the applicable Pricing Supplement. This presents certain risks relating to currency conversions if an investor's financial activities are denominated principally in a currency or currency unit (the "Investor's Currency") other than the Specified Currency. These include the risk that exchange rates may significantly change (including changes due to devaluation of the Specified Currency or revaluation of the Investor's Currency) and the risk that authorities with jurisdiction over the Investor's Currency may impose or modify exchange controls. An appreciation in the value of the Investor's Currency relative to the Specified Currency would decrease (i) the Investor's Currency equivalent value of the principal payable on the Notes and (iii) the Investor's Currency equivalent market value of the Notes.

Government and monetary authorities may impose (as some have done in the past) exchange controls that could adversely affect an applicable exchange rate. As a result, investors may receive less interest or principal than expected, or no interest or principal.

Interest rate risks

The Notes may bear interest at a fixed rate. Potential investors should note that if interest rates rise, then the income payable on such Notes might become less attractive and the price that investors could realise on a sale of the Notes may fall. However, the market price of the Notes from time to time has no effect on the total income investors receive on maturity of the Notes if the investor holds the Notes until the Maturity Date or Longstop Maturity Date (as applicable). Further, inflation will reduce the real value of the Notes over time, which may affect what investors could buy with their investment in the future and may make the fixed rate payable on the Notes less attractive in the future, again affecting the price that investors could realise on a sale of the Notes.

Regulation and reform of LIBOR, EURIBOR or other "benchmarks" could adversely affect any Notes linked to such "benchmarks"

LIBOR, EURIBOR and other rates and indices which are deemed to be "benchmarks" are the subject of recent national, international and other regulatory guidance and proposals for reform. Some of these reforms are already effective whilst others are still to be implemented. These reforms may cause such benchmarks to perform differently than in the past, to disappear entirely, or have other consequences which cannot be predicted. Any such consequence could have a material adverse effect on any Notes linked to such a "benchmark".

Regulation (EU) 2016/1011 (the "Benchmarks Regulation") was published in the official journal on 29 June 2016 and became applicable from 1 January 2018 (with the exception of provisions specified in Article 59 (mainly on critical benchmarks) that have applied from 30 June 2016). The Benchmarks Regulation could have a material impact on any Notes linked to LIBOR, EURIBOR or another "benchmark" rate or index, in particular, if the methodology or other terms of the "benchmark" are changed in order to comply with the terms of the Benchmarks Regulation, and such changes could (amongst other things) have the effect of reducing or increasing the rate or level, or affecting the volatility of the published rate or level, of the benchmark. In addition, the Benchmarks Regulation stipulates that each administrator of a "benchmark" regulated thereunder must be licensed by the competent authority of the Member State where such administrator is located. There is a risk that administrators of certain "benchmarks" will fail to obtain a necessary licence, preventing them from continuing to provide such "benchmarks". Other administrators may cease to administer certain "benchmarks" because of the additional costs of compliance with the Benchmarks Regulation and other applicable regulations, and the risks associated therewith.

As an example of such benchmark reforms, on 27 July 2017, the UK Financial Conduct Authority announced that it will no longer persuade or compel banks to submit rates for the calculation of the LIBOR benchmark after 2021 (the "FCA Announcement"). In a further speech on 12 July 2018, the FCA emphasised that market participants should not rely on the continued publication of LIBOR after the end of 2021, which indicates that the continuation of LIBOR on the current basis cannot and will not be guaranteed after 2021. The FCA Announcement and 12 July 2018 speech indicate that the continuation of LIBOR on the current basis cannot and will not be guaranteed after 2021.

EURIBOR is also undergoing reform and it is not yet known whether or not it will be complaint with the Benchmark Regulation at the end of the transitional period. EMMI, the administrator of EONIA, has stated that EONIA's compliance with the Benchmark Regulation by January 2020 "cannot be warranted". It is therefore not possible to predict whether and to what extent LIBOR, EURIBOR and EONIA will continue to be available in their current form in the future. To the extent they continue to be available in their current form, they may perform differently than in the past or there may be other consequences that cannot be predicted.

The potential elimination of the LIBOR benchmark or any other benchmark, or changes in the manner of administration of any benchmark could require or result in an adjustment to the interest provisions of the terms and conditions, or result in other consequences, in respect of any Notes

linked to such benchmark. In certain circumstances the ultimate fall-back of interest for a particular Interest Period may result in the rate of interest for the last preceding Interest Period being used. This may result in the effective application of a fixed rate for Floating Rate Notes based on the rate which was last observed on the Relevant Screen Page.

The market continues to develop in relation to Notes that reference SONIA and SOFR

On 29 November 2017, the Bank of England and the FCA announced that the Bank of England's Working Group on Sterling Risk-Free Rates had been mandated with implementing a broad-based transition to the Sterling Overnight Index Average ("SONIA") over the following four years across sterling bond, loan and derivatives markets, so that SONIA is established as the primary sterling interest rate benchmark by the end of 2021. Investors should be aware that the market continues to develop in relation to SONIA as a reference rate in the capital markets and its adoption as an alternative to Sterling LIBOR. In particular, market participants and relevant working groups are exploring alternative reference rates based on SONIA, including term SONIA reference rates (which seek to measure the market's forward expectation of an average SONIA rate over a designated term).

The Secured Overnight Financing Rate ("SOFR") is published by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York (the "Federal Reserve") and is intended to be a broad measure of the cost of borrowing cash overnight collateralised by Treasury securities and a current preferred replacement rate to the U.S. LIBOR. The Federal Reserve notes on its publication page for SOFR that the Federal Reserve may alter the methods of calculation, publication schedule, rate revision practices or availability of SOFR at any time without notice.

The market or a significant part thereof may adopt an application of SONIA and/or SOFR that differs significantly from that set out in the Conditions and used in relation to Notes that reference a SONIA or SOFR rate issued under this Programme. The Issuer may in the future also issue Notes referencing SONIA or SOFR that differ materially in terms of interest determination when compared with any previous SONIA or SOFR referenced Notes issued by it under the Programme.

In addition, the manner of adoption or application of SONIA or SOFR reference rates in the Eurobond markets may differ materially compared with the application and adoption of SONIA or SOFR in other markets, such as the derivatives and loan markets. Investors should carefully consider how any mismatch between the adoption of SONIA or SOFR reference rates across these markets may impact any hedging or other financial arrangements which they may put in place in connection with any acquisition, holding or disposal of Notes referencing SONIA or SOFR.

Since both SONIA and SOFR are relatively new market indices, Notes linked to SONIA or SOFR may have no established trading market when issued, and an established trading market may never develop or may not be very liquid. Market terms for debt securities indexed to SONIA or SOFR, such as the spread over the index reflected in interest rate provisions, may evolve over time, and trading prices of such Notes may be lower than those of later-issued indexed debt securities as a result. Further, if SONIA or SOFR do not prove to be widely used in securities like the Notes, the trading price of such Notes linked to SONIA or SOFR may be lower than those of Notes linked to indices that are more widely used. Investors in such Notes may not be able to sell such Notes at all or may not be able to sell such Notes at prices that will provide them with a yield comparable to similar investments that have a developed secondary market and may consequently suffer from increased pricing volatility and market risk. There can also be no guarantee that SONIA and/or SOFR will not be discontinued or fundamentally altered in a manner that is materially adverse to the interests of investors in Notes referencing SONIA and/or SOFR, as the case may be. If the manner in which SONIA or SOFR is calculated is changed, that change may result in a reduction of the amount of interest payable on such Notes and the trading prices of such Notes.

Any such consequences could have a material adverse effect on the value and return on any such Notes

More broadly, any of the international, national or other proposals for reform, or the general increased regulatory scrutiny of "benchmarks", could increase the costs and risks of administering or otherwise participating in the setting of a "benchmark" and complying with any such regulations or requirements. Such factors may have the effect of discouraging market participants from continuing to administer or contribute to certain "benchmarks", trigger changes in the rules or methodologies used in certain "benchmarks" or lead to the disappearance of certain "benchmarks". Any of the above changes or any other consequential changes as a result of international, national or other proposals for reform or other initiatives or investigations, could have a material adverse effect on the value of and return on any Notes linked to a "benchmark".

Credit ratings may not reflect all risks

Notes issued under the Programme may be rated or unrated. Where an issue of Notes is rated, the applicable rating(s) will be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement. Such rating(s) will not necessarily be the same as the rating assigned to Notes already issued. There are no guarantees that such ratings will be assigned or maintained. Any credit rating agency may lower its ratings or withdraw the rating if, in the sole judgment of the credit rating agency, the credit quality of the Notes has declined or is in question. In addition, at any time a credit rating agency may revise its relevant rating methodology with the result that, among other things, any rating assigned to the Notes may be lowered. If any of the ratings assigned to the Notes is lowered or withdrawn, the market value of the Notes may be reduced. Furthermore, the ratings may not reflect the potential impact of all risks discussed above, and other factors that may affect the value of the Notes. Accordingly, a credit rating is not a recommendation to buy, sell or hold securities and may be revised or withdrawn by the rating agency at any time.

Any credit ratings assigned to the Notes may not reflect the potential impact of all risks related to structure, market, additional factors discussed above, and other factors that may affect the value of the Notes.

A credit rating reduction may result in a reduction in the trading value of the Notes

The value of the Notes is expected to be affected, in part, by investors' general appraisal of the creditworthiness of the Issuer. Such perceptions are generally influenced by the ratings accorded to the outstanding Notes of such Issuer by standard statistical rating services. A reduction in, or a placing on credit watch of the rating, if any, accorded to outstanding Notes of the Issuer by a rating agency could result in a reduction in the trading value of the Notes.

Legal investment considerations may restrict certain investments

The investment activities of certain investors are subject to legal investment laws and regulations, or review or regulation by certain authorities. Each potential investor should consult its legal advisers to determine whether and to what extent (i) Notes are legal investments for it, (ii) Notes can be used as collateral for various types of borrowing and (iii) other restrictions apply to its purchase or pledge of any Notes. Financial institutions should consult their legal advisors or the appropriate regulators to determine the appropriate treatment of Notes under any applicable risk based capital or similar rules.

Yield

Any indication of yield (i.e. the income returns on the Notes) stated within the applicable Pricing Supplement applies only to investments made at (as opposed to above or below) the issue price of the relevant Notes. If an investor invests in the Notes at a price other than the issue price of the Notes, the yield on the investment will be different from any indication of yield on the Notes as set out in the applicable Pricing Supplement.

Trustee indemnity

In certain circumstances, the Noteholders may be dependent on the Trustee to take certain actions

in respect of the Notes. Prior to taking such action, pursuant to the Conditions the Trustee may require to be indemnified and/or secured and/or pre-funded to its satisfaction. If so, and the Trustee is not indemnified and/or secured and/or pre-funded to its satisfaction, it may decide not to take any action and such inaction will not constitute a breach by it of its obligations under the Trust Deed. Consequently, the Noteholders would have to either provide such indemnity and/or security and/or pre-funding or accept the consequences of such inaction by the Trustee. Noteholders should be prepared to bear the costs associated with any such indemnity and/or security and/or pre-funding and/or the consequences of any potential inaction by the Trustee. Such inaction by the Trustee will not entitle Noteholders to take action directly against the Issuer to pursue remedies for any breach by it of the terms of the Trust Deed or the Notes unless the Trustee has failed within a reasonable time to do so.

Brexit

On 31 January 2020 the United Kingdom left the European Union and began a transition period that is set to end on 31 December 2020, during which the United Kingdom and the European Union will negotiate their future relationship. There are a number of uncertainties in connection with the future of the United Kingdom and its relationship with the European Union and it is not possible to determine the exact impact that the United Kingdom's departure from the European Union and/or any related matters may have on the business of the Issuer.

There is a risk that the UK will implement new legislation to replace current legislation which complies with or is derived from EU law and which may differ in a material way from the current existing law in place, resulting in the Issuer having to adopt new measures and policies to ensure compliance with that new law, which could give rise to higher costs of compliance as well as potentially impacting the way the Issuer is able to conduct its business.

Any such changes could have an adverse effect on the Issuer's results of operations, financial condition and prospects and may affect the Issuer's ability to repay amounts owing to Noteholders.

COVID-19 Outbreak

The COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic (referred to as, "Covid-19"), which first emerged in China in late December 2019, has now spread globally and been declared a worldwide pandemic. It is severely restricting the movement of people globally and locally; it is restricting global and local trade; and it is likely to disrupt the revenues of businesses and individuals. Although there has not been significant impact to the Issuer's performance to date, the situation is evolving rapidly and the Issuer is closely monitoring the potential impact on the United Kingdom economy and the Issuer's operations. While the United Kingdom government, and other governments around the world, are seeking to mitigate the effects of the pandemic with fiscal and monetary stimulus as well as wage protections and strict social restrictions, there can be no certainty that these measures will be successful in averting sustained economic contraction, potential economic recession and loss of investor confidence.

OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAMME

THE ISSUER

General

Under the Programme, the Issuer will, from time to time, issue Notes in Series and will use the proceeds of such loan, less certain costs and expenses, to advance a loan to Propifi Investments Limited (the "Principal Borrower") (the "Principal Loan") who will use the proceeds to (i) advance loans (each a "Borrower Loan" and, together, the "Borrower Loans") to borrowers (each a "Borrower" and, together, the "Borrowers") meeting eligibility criteria, pursuant to the terms of a loan agreement (each, a "Borrower Loan Agreement" and, together, the "Borrower Loan Agreements"); and/or (ii) acquire financial collateral including, without limitation, debt securities, in each case meeting eligibility criteria (each a "Financial Collateral Asset" and, together, the "Financial Collateral Assets"). The Principal Loan, the Borrower Loans, the Financial Collateral Assets and each Borrower Deed of Charge (see below) are, collectively, referred to as the "Secured Assets".

The Servicer (see below) will service the Secured Assets on behalf of the Issuer and the Principal Borrower and collect in all relevant payments.

The Issuer will create separate Series of Notes from time to time to enable Notes to be issued with varying terms and interest rates. Following the relevant issue date of Notes, the Issuer will make a loan to the Principal Borrower to enable the Principal Borrower to enter into Borrower Loans or acquire Financial Collateral Assets in an aggregate principal amount equal to the amount set out in the Pricing Supplement for such Series. Such amounts will equal the aggregate nominal amount of Notes being issued pursuant to such Series less certain costs and expenses of the Issuer and an amount which the Issuer determines is required to be kept in cash or cash equivalents for liquidity purposes.

In respect of each Series of Notes, there will be more than 5 Borrowers and the principal amount of each Borrower Loan or of each Financial Collateral Asset will not account for more than 20% of the aggregate principal amount of all Borrower Loans or all Financial Collateral Assets outstanding in respect of that Series.

The Borrower Loans or the Financial Collateral Assets will comprise bridging loans. In each case, where the Borrower Loans or the Financial Collateral Assets are secured, the security will include security over tangible commercial or residential property. Payments of interest and repayment of principal by the Borrower will be matched to interest and principal payment dates of the Notes. Where a material portion of the assets are secured on or backed by real property, the Issuer and the Principal Borrower will prepare a valuation report relating to the property setting out both the valuation of the real property and its related cash flow. The Issuer's obligations under the Notes are secured in the manner described below --"The Issuer Security Structure".


The Principal Borrower's obligations to the Issuer are secured in the manner described below – "The Principal Borrower Security Structure".

Where a Borrower Loan is secured, a Borrower's obligations to the Principal Borrower pursuant to the Borrower Loan Agreements are secured in the manner described below -- "The Borrower Security Structure".

Credit Enhancements

The Notes will not be subject to any credit enhancements and the Issuer will rely on the repayments to be made by the Principal Borrower and the Borrowers pursuant to the Secured Assets and the proceeds of any property disposals to ensure that the Issuer is able to meet its obligations under the Notes.

STRUCTURE OF THE PROGRAMME



THE ISSUER SECURITY STRUCTURE

Under a deed of charge dated 23 June 2020 between the Issuer and Truva Trustees Limited (the "Trustee") (as amended and supplemented from time to time, the "Issuer Deed of Charge"), the obligations of the Issuer under a Series of Notes will be secured in favour of the Trustee (for the benefit of the Noteholders and certain other secured creditors of the Issuer in respect of such Series (the "Issuer Secured Creditors")) by fixed and floating first priority security over the Issuer's rights in respect of the Secured Assets and the Transaction Documents to the extent that they relate to such Series and, where applicable, over any segregated bank accounts opened by the Issuer in respect of such Series (the "Issuer Security").

In respect of any Series, by granting the Issuer Security to the Trustee for the benefit of the Issuer Secured Creditors, the rights of the Noteholders and the other Issuer Secured Creditors to the Issuer Security in respect of such Series rank first in priority to other creditors (including any affiliates of the Issuer) in the event of a default or an insolvency or insolvency related event of the Issuer. The rights of the Noteholders and the other Issuer Secured Creditors will not be affected by the insolvency or an insolvency related event of any other entity affiliated to the Issuer.

THE PRINCIPAL BORROWER SECURITY STRUCTURE

Under a deed of charge to be entered into between the Principal Borrower and the Trustee (the "Deed of Charge"), the obligations of the Principal Borrower in respect of the Principal Loan will be secured in favour of the Trustee by fixed and floating charges over the property, undertaking and assets of the Principal Borrower (the "Principal Borrower Security").

The Principal Borrower Deed of Charge will contain customary representations and warranties from the Principal Borrower to the Trustee, including, without limitation, representations and warranties as to the ownership by the Principal Borrower of its assets, that such assets are free from other security, that there are no adverse claims against such assets, that the Principal Borrower has complied with all relevant laws in respect of those assets and that the security being granted under the Borrower Deed of Charge is enforceable.

THE BORROWER SECURITY STRUCTURE

Where a Borrower Loan is secured, under a deed of charge to be entered into between Propifi Security Trustee (the "Borrower Security Trustee") and the Issuer (each a "Borrower Deed of Charge"), the obligations of the Borrower in respect of a Borrower Loan will be secured in favour of the Issuer by fixed and floating charges over the property, undertaking and assets of the Borrower, and, personal guarantees may be taken from the principal and/or the majority or main shareholders of the Borrower (the "Borrower Security").

Borrower Security Trustee is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales with company number 11727019. Its ownership structure is set out below, in the section entitled "Description of the Issuer". The Borrower Security Trustee will hold the benefit of each Borrower Deed of Charge on trust for the Issuer pursuant to a security trust agreement between the Issuer and the Borrower Security Trustee (the "Security Trust Agreement").

In respect of each Series, the Borrower Security Trustee will take a transfer from the Issuer of the legal (but not beneficial) estate and title in each applicable Borrower Loan and related Borrower Security and agrees to hold such legal estate and title as bare trustee for the benefit of the Issuer in accordance with the provisions of the Borrower Security Trust Agreement. The Issuer will at all times hold the beneficial title of each applicable Borrower Loan and related Borrower Security.

MARKET OVERVIEW

The Principal Borrower's business focus is bridge lending, a sector having experienced significant growth in recent years and which continues to project positive growth trends.

The bridge lending market is both highly fragmented and competitive, with different areas of focus providing differentiation between lenders.

MARKET REVIEW

(Source Mortgage Finance Gazette Jonathan Sealey, CEO of Hope Capital, Sept 2019)

According to lenders (Ref. EY Bridging Market Study), broker-related channels are still the most important source of loan originations, as opposed to aggregator websites, or third-party referrals. Regarding the purpose of these bridge, refurbishment (followed by business purposes), is the top reason for bridge loan applications, according to 55% of respondents (*Ref. EY Bridging Market Study*).

PURPOSE OF BRIDGE LOANS

Bridging has long since moved on from its original purpose as either a vehicle for auction purchase or for people buying a home before selling their existing one. While these are, of course, still valid uses of a bridging loan, far more prolific now is its use by developers, landlords and property investors to buy, refurbish and/or develop property.

Many businesses also turned to short-term lenders to provide them with finance, driven by a lack of commercial lending by high street banks. Consequently, businesses of all types now use bridging as a fast source of additional capital, borrowing to fund business acquisition, expansion or take advantage of other opportunities.

The EY survey conducted in March this year, found 32% of bridging loans were now for business use with 29% for refurbishment. Interestingly, almost a fifth (17%) were used for mortgage delays.

So, far from being the lending of last resort, bridging is increasingly the first-choice option, meeting a very specific need.

What hasn't changed is the need for bridging and short-term loans to be both fast and flexible. This still calls for individual underwriting with each case looked at on its specific merits with a turnaround time of days if not hours. Achieving this while carrying out thorough due diligence is key to success.

THE EVOLUTION OF BRIDGING

The bridging market now bears little resemblance to that of ten years ago. In a recent survey by the EY Financial Services Corporate Finance team, 79% of lenders surveyed believe the market size to be more than £3 billion with 29% estimating it to be over £5 billion. The actual size of the bridging market cannot be measured as it comprises a large number of smaller lenders across the country with no formal register of who is lending. But 60% of those surveyed by EY expect the market to continue to grow.

Historically, bridging may have been seen as lending of last resort, but this is no longer the case. Many firms are now as respectable, and well run, as any mainstream mortgage lender. And, there is a growing awareness of the valuable role that bridging and short-term lending plays, not only for homeowners but particularly for businesses and developers.

The Association of Short-Term Lenders has played a big part in this growing respectability. While there were always reputable bridging lenders, the ASTL's Code of Conduct and Values Charter has helped raise standards across its membership and in turn across the market.

What did not change as quickly was the perception of bridging as a place to make quick money. The credit crunch, followed by the implementation of the Mortgage Market Review, saw returns in the mainstream market plummet. The bridging market, meanwhile, with its flexible underwriting and case-by-case lending, remained relatively buoyant.

There has consequently been an influx of new lenders over the past few years, each viewing the bridging industry as the way to make the returns no longer available either on the high street or the stock market. However, both small and larger lenders entering the bridging arena have discovered bridging is not the easy money it may appear to be. The rewards are accompanied by risks, are known and catered for by professional bridge lenders through stringent due diligence.

This has caught out many unwary smaller lenders, while larger names have discovered that, in order to put sensible measures in place to mitigate any risks, the returns are no longer what they expected. Hence, we have witnessed challenger banks particularly, coming into bridging, then leaving again. Where some larger lenders have been more successful is in funding existing bridging lenders. This mitigates many of the risks while also providing higher returns that cannot be achieved through mainstream lending.

EXIT ROUTES

Responsible lending for bridge lenders is not about a borrower's ability to make monthly payments but more about exit routes.

Unlike a twenty-year repayment mortgage, paid off in instalments over the term, bridge loans have more in common with interest-only mortgages, with the entire sum paid off at the end. Only, in the case of bridging, it is more usually a loan term of between three and 24 months. Therefore, the most fundamental issue affecting all bridge lenders is: what is the exit route, and do I stand a realistic chance of having my funds returned within the set time period?

Key questions are: Is the borrower intending to move onto a longer-term loan or sell the relevant assets? Often a developer will buy a property in a state of disrepair, or one to adapt into flats or a house in multiple occupation, then take out a buy-to-let mortgage to let-out the completed properties.

Other property investors will plan to sell the property or properties once any work has been completed. Consequently, a bridge lender has to weigh up how realistic that sale or refinance will be both within the forecast time period and for the amount the borrower is expecting to achieve.

Bridge lenders therefore need to understand more than just their own sector when looking to grant a loan. Every prudent bridge lender will want to know up front, the likelihood of their borrower obtaining a longer-term mortgage or sale. They therefore also need to be in touch, both with the underwriting policies of mainstream lenders and the predicted movement of property prices in the region they are considering lending.


WEST ONE BRIDGING INDEX JUNE 2019

(Recognised as a key measurement tool of the UK Bridging industry.)

The latest edition of the West One Loans Bridging Index calculates that gross annual bridging lending stayed flat, at approximately £5.6bn for the third quarter of 2019. Estimates show that Q3 lending was down slightly against the previous quarter – as is expected during the quieter summer months – but that overall performance of the sector remains strong, as indicated by these annualised figures. With the property market still causing concern for many, average transaction sizes fell in the third quarter, indicating prudent decisions being made by both borrowers and lenders.

REGULATED AND UNREGULATED BRIDGING LOANS

The Principal Borrower does not operate in the regulated "consumer" bridging loan market. The FCA took over responsibility for all consumer credit regulation in April 2014 and this includes two types of regulated bridge loans:

- 1. loans which are secured by means of a first legal charge over the home of the borrower (or the borrower's family/partner), which are regulated by reference to the Mortgages and Home Finance: Conduct of Business Sourcebook; and
- 2. loans which are secured by a second charge over the home of the borrower (or the borrower's family/partner), which are regulated by reference to the Consumer Credit Sourcebook.

Loans which fall under (1) and (2) above are not regulated if any of the following apply:

- 1. neither the borrower, their partner or any members of their family occupy the property;
- 2. the loan is for over £25,000 and is predominantly for business purposes; and
- 3. the borrower is regarded as a high net worth individual/ sophisticated investor.

All bridge loans made by the Principal Borrower are not subject to FCA regulations.

KEY ATTRIBUTES OF BRIDGE LOANS

The number of providers in the UK market ensures that there is product differentiation available to the discerning user of a bridging facility. Nevertheless, typically there will remain some constant, defining features as follows:

1. single bullet repayment at maturity;

- 2. interest either rolled up and paid at maturity or deducted from the initial advance;
- 3. fast offer and execution of facilities by providers;
- 4. facility term typically 3-12 months;
- 5. significant penalties for stretching beyond the stated facility term;
- 6. simple and non-subjective underwriting criteria; and
- 7. loan to value ("LTV") of 70% or less.

UNDERWRITING

Underwriting tends to be very focussed on two key considerations –

- 1. valuation and LTV, and
- 2. exit from the loan.

VALUATION AND LTV

Most lenders will employ the services of an RICS qualified professional valuation agent for the valuation of property assets. Some of the larger and more established providers will have in-house functionality to perform this service, although this is relatively rare as lenders will generally feel more comfortable having the ability to rely on a third party's professional indemnity insurance cover.


The majority of lenders will focus in on 70% LTV as being their maximum level of advance, although competition and innovation in the market is driving some higher LTV figures. (*EY – UK bridging market study; A view for 2018 and beyond*), although Bridging Trends, a quarterly publication published by bridging lender MT Finance Limited, recently reported that this figure had grown across their member businesses to 57% for Q4 2018 (Bridging Trends).

FACILITY EXIT

Typically, exit from a bridging facility will be facilitated either by a sale of the asset or a refinancing, often with the benefit of an enhanced value. The lender will normally be able to monitor the borrower's progress towards a timely exit.

MARKET GROWTH

Forecasts by Mintel indicate that the UK bridging market has experienced strong annual growth since 2013, with this trend expected to continue, despite some market uncertainty following the UK Brexit referendum (*Mintel Group Limited, forecasts published in the EY - UK bridging market study*).

Compound annual growth of 11% is indicated in the period 2018-2022 by these forecasts, with the strongest growth being expected in the "Commercial" and "Development" market sectors where the Principal Borrower's efforts will be focused.

FACTORS DRIVING MARKET GROWTH

There are many factors driving the continued and forecast robust growth of the UK bridging market. The main factors can be summarised as follows:

- 1. historic strong growth, performance and liquidity of the UK property market generally, driven by structural under-supply;
- 2. reluctance of high street banks and mainstream lenders supplying the market directly or providing wholesale lines;
- 3. strong buy-to-let market and the proliferation of small-scale private landlords, although decreasingly so since UK tax reforms in this area;
- 4. more sympathetic planning regimes, driven at governmental level by the need to address the under-supply of housing stock; and
- 5. significant new entrants assisting with servicing borrower demand.

BRIDGING INTEREST RATES


The Bank of England has stated that it expects to maintain its base interest rates over the next 3 years, an increase in which would cause greater caution in the property market. Lenders are unlikely to experience any increase in the cost of funds, and therefore bridging interest rates should remain unaffected by base rate changes in the short-to-medium term. The sectors attraction of new entrants should counteract lenders leaving the market, therefore having a minimal effect on rates

ORIGINATIONS

Primary Channels for Loan Originations:

Respondents consider broker-related channels as the most important for loan originations, with 84% citing 'independent brokers' and 65% citing 'master brokers' as any of their top two channels for loan originations. 'Third party referrals' appears to be a less important channel, with only 7% citing this as important.

- 1. 84% of respondents cited 'aggregator websites' as either the second least or the least important channel for loan originations.
- 2. For 45% of respondents, the average days to completion on loans is between 35 and 40 days.
- 3. 62% of respondents cited 'cost of origination' between 1% and 2%.




UK BRIDGING FINANCE MARKET TRENDS


Recent and expected trends in the UK bridging finance market:

1. 74% of respondents believe that the 'average monthly interest rate' fell over the last 12 months, in contrast, only 32% of respondents are expecting it to decrease over the next

12 months. We can also observe an increase in the % of respondents who believe the 'average interest rate' will increase over the next 12 months.

- 2. Although no respondents cited a decreasing trend in the proportion of regulated vs. unregulated loans over the past 12 months, 11% foresee a decline over next year.
- 3. Only 39% of the respondents believe 'competition' will increase over the next 12 months, even though 66% cited this trend over the past 12 months.
- 4. 55% of respondents are expecting an increase in repossessions, a significant increase on people's view on the last 12 months.





ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR SECURED ASSETS

Borrower Loans being acquired or made with the proceeds of a Note issuance and the subsequent Principal Loan and each other Secured Asset (other than a Borrower Deed of Charge) must meet the following "Secured Asset Eligibility Criteria":





Each Tranche of Notes will be in the form of either (i) individual note certificates in registered form ("Individual Note Certificates"), (ii) a global note in registered form (a "Global Registered Note"), (iii) dematerialised uncertificated registered form in accordance with the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001 (SI 2001/3755) (the "Uncertificated Regulations"), in CREST (as detailed below), or (iv) dematerialised depositary interests issued, held, settled and transferred through CREST (as detailed below), in each case as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement.

- (a) *Programme*: Propifi Bonds PLC (the "**Issuer**") has established a Secured Medium Term Note Programme (the "**Programme**") for the issuance of notes (the "**Notes**").
- (b) Pricing Supplement: Notes issued under the Programme are issued in series (each a "Series") and each Series may comprise one or more tranches (each a "Tranche") of Notes. Each Tranche is the subject of a Pricing Supplement (the "Pricing Supplement") which completes these terms and conditions (the "Conditions"). The terms and conditions applicable to any particular Tranche of Notes are these Conditions as completed by the relevant Pricing Supplement. In the event of any inconsistency between these Conditions and the relevant Pricing Supplement, the relevant Pricing Supplement shall prevail.
- (c) Trust Deed: The Notes are constituted by, are subject to, and have the benefit of, a trust deed made with effect from 23 June 2020 (as amended or supplemented from time to time, the "Trust Deed") between the Issuer and Truva Services Limited (the "Trustee", which expression includes all persons for the time being trustee or trustees appointed under the Trust Deed).

In these Conditions references to the "Agents" are to the Registrar, the Paying Agents, the Transfer Agents, the Servicer and the Calculation Agent and any reference to an "Agent" is to any one of them.

- (g) The Notes: The Notes will be issued in registered form. Pursuant to the Issuer's Articles of Association, the execution by the Issuer of any Individual Note Certificates (as defined below) representing Notes issued under the Programme will be under hand and not under seal. All subsequent references in these Conditions to "Notes" are to the Notes which are the subject of the relevant Pricing Supplement. - (h) Summaries: Certain provisions of these Conditions are summaries of the Trust Deed and the Agency Agreement and are subject to their detailed provisions. "euro" means the single currency introduced at the start of the third stage of European economic and monetary union, and as defined in Article 2 of Council

Regulation (EC) No. 974/98 of 3 May 1998 on the introduction of the euro as amended;

"Event of Default" means an event described in Condition 12 (Events of Default);

"Extraordinary Resolution" has the meaning given in the Trust Deed;

"Final Redemption Amount" means, in respect of any Note, its principal amount or such other amount as may be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Financial Collateral Assets" means financial assets including, without limitation, (a) cash and (b) debt securities.

"First Interest Payment Date" means the date specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Fitch" means Fitch Ratings Ltd or any successor thereof;

"Fixed Coupon Amount" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"**Holder**" has the meaning given in Condition 3(d) (*Form, Denomination and Title - Title to Notes*);

"Indebtedness" means any indebtedness for money borrowed or raised including (without limitation) any indebtedness for or in respect of:

- (i) amounts raised by acceptance under any acceptance credit facility;
- (ii) amounts raised under any note purchase facility;
- (iii) the amount of any liability in respect of leases or hire purchase contracts which would, in accordance with applicable law and generally accepted accounting principles, be treated as finance or capital leases;
- (iv) the amount of any liability in respect of any purchase price for assets or services the payment of which is deferred for a period in excess of 60 days; and
- amounts raised under any other transaction (including, without limitation, any forward sale or purchase agreement) having the commercial effect of a borrowing;

"Interest Amount" means, in relation to a Note and an Interest Period, the amount of interest payable in respect of that Note for that Interest Period;

"Interest Commencement Date" means the Issue Date of the Notes or such other date as may be specified as the Interest Commencement Date in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Interest Determination Date" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Interest Payment Date" means the First Interest Payment Date and any other date or dates specified as such in, or determined in accordance with the provisions of, the relevant Pricing Supplement and, if a Business Day Convention is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement:

- (i) as the same may be adjusted in accordance with the relevant Business Day Convention; or
- (ii) if the Business Day Convention is the FRN Convention, Floating Rate Convention or Eurodollar Convention and an interval of a number of calendar

months is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being the Specified Period, each of such dates as may occur in accordance with the FRN Convention, Floating Rate Convention or Eurodollar Convention at such Specified Period of calendar months following the Interest Commencement Date (in the case of the first Interest Payment Date) or the previous Interest Payment Date (in any other case);

"Interest Period" means each period beginning on (and including) the Interest Commencement Date or any Interest Payment Date and ending on (but excluding) the next Interest Payment Date;

"ISDA Definitions" means the 2000 ISDA Definitions (as amended and updated as at the date of issue of the first Tranche of the Notes of the relevant Series (as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement) as published by the International Swaps and Derivatives Association, Inc.) or, if so specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, the 2006 ISDA Definitions (as amended and updated as at the date of issue of the first Tranche of the Notes of the relevant Series (as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement) as published by the International Swaps and Derivatives Association, Inc.);

"Issuer Secured Creditors" means each of (a) the Noteholders, (b) the Couponholders, (c) the Trustee, and (d) the Agents;

"Issue Date" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"LIBOR" means, in respect of any specified currency and any specified period, the interest rate benchmark known as the London interbank offered rate which is calculated and published by a designated distributor (currently Thomson Reuters) in accordance with the requirements from time to time of ICE Benchmark Administration Limited (or any other person which takes over the administration of that rate) based on estimated interbank borrowing rates for a number of designated currencies and maturities which are provided, in respect of each such currency, by a panel of contributor banks (details of historic LIBOR rates can be obtained from the designated distributor);

"Margin" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Maturity Date" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Maximum Redemption Amount" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Minimum Redemption Amount" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Moody's" means Moody's Investor Services Limited or any successor thereof;

"Noteholder" has the meaning given in Condition 3(d)(Form, Denomination and Title - Title to Notes);

"Optional Redemption Amount (Call)" means, in respect of any Note, its principal amount or such other amount as may be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Optional Redemption Amount (Put)" means, in respect of any Note, its principal amount or such other amount as may be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Optional Redemption Date (Call)" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Optional Redemption Date (Put)" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing

Supplement;

"Payment Business Day" means:

- (i) if the currency of payment is euro, any day which is:
 - (A) a day on which banks in the relevant place of presentation are open for presentation and payment of bearer debt securities and for dealings in foreign currencies; and
 - (B) in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a TARGET Settlement Day and a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre; or
- (ii) if the currency of payment is not euro, any day which is:
 - (A) a day on which banks in the relevant place of presentation are open for presentation and payment of bearer debt securities and for dealings in foreign currencies; and
 - (B) in the case of payment by transfer to an account, a day on which dealings in foreign currencies may be carried on in the Principal Financial Centre of the currency of payment and in each (if any) Additional Financial Centre;

"**Person**" means any individual, company, corporation, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, organisation, state or agency of a state or other entity, whether or not having separate legal personality;

"Principal Financial Centre" means, in relation to any currency, the principal financial centre for that currency provided, however, that in relation to euro, it means the principal financial centre of such Member State of the European Communities as is selected (in the case of a payment) by the payee or (in the case of a calculation) by the Calculation Agent;

"**Put Option Notice**" means a notice which must be delivered to a Paying Agent by any Noteholder wanting to exercise a right to redeem a Note at the option of the Noteholder;

"**Put Option Receipt**" means a receipt issued by a Paying Agent to a depositing Noteholder upon deposit of a Note with such Paying Agent by any Noteholder wanting to exercise a right to redeem a Note at the option of the Noteholder;

"Quotation Time" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Redemption Amount" means, as appropriate, the Final Redemption Amount, the Early Redemption Amount, the Optional Redemption Amount (Call), the Optional Redemption Amount (Put), the Early Termination Amount or such other amount in the nature of a redemption amount as may be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Redemption Margin" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Reference Banks" means four major banks selected by the Calculation Agent in the market that is most closely connected with the Reference Rate;

"Reference Date" will be set out in the relevant notice of redemption;

"Reference Price" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Reference Rate" means EURIBOR, LIBOR, SONIA, SOFR or EONIA as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement in respect of the currency and period specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Register" means the register maintained by the Registrar in respect of the Notes in accordance with the Agency Agreement;

"Regular Period" means:

- (i) in the case of Notes where interest is scheduled to be paid only by means of regular payments, each period from and including the Interest Commencement Date to but excluding the first Interest Payment Date and each successive period from and including one Interest Payment Date to but excluding the next Interest Payment Date;
- (ii) in the case of Notes where, apart from the first Interest Period, interest is scheduled to be paid only by means of regular payments, each period from and including a Regular Date falling in any year to but excluding the next Regular Date, where "Regular Date" means the day and month (but not the year) on which any Interest Payment Date falls; and
- (iii) in the case of Notes where, apart from one Interest Period other than the first Interest Period, interest is scheduled to be paid only by means of regular payments, each period from and including a Regular Date falling in any year to but excluding the next Regular Date, where "Regular Date" means the day and month (but not the year) on which any Interest Payment Date falls other than the Interest Payment Date falling at the end of the irregular Interest Period;

"Relevant Date" means, in relation to any payment, whichever is the later of (a) the date on which the payment in question first becomes due and (b) if the full amount payable has not been received in the Principal Financial Centre of the currency of payment by the Paying Agent or the Trustee on or prior to such due date, the date on which (the full amount having been so received) notice to that effect has been given to the Noteholders;

"Relevant Financial Centre" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Relevant Screen Page" means the page, section or other part of a particular information service (including, without limitation, Reuters) specified as the Relevant Screen Page in the relevant Pricing Supplement, or such other page, section or other part as may replace it on that information service or such other information service, in each case, as may be nominated by the Person providing or sponsoring the information appearing there for the purpose of displaying rates or prices comparable to the Reference Rate;

"Relevant Time" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Reserved Matter" means any proposal to change any date fixed for payment of principal or interest in respect of the Notes, to reduce the amount of principal or interest payable on any date in respect of the Notes, to alter the method of calculating

the amount of any payment in respect of the Notes or the date for any such payment, to change the currency of any payment under the Notes or to change the quorum requirements relating to meetings or the majority required to pass an Extraordinary Resolution;

"Secured Assets" means the Borrower Loans, the Financial Collateral Assets and each Borrower Deed of Charge.

"Security" means any Security Interest created, evidenced or conferred by or under the Trust Deed and Issuer Deed of Charge;

"Security Interest" means any mortgage, charge, pledge, lien or other security interest including, without limitation, anything analogous to any of the foregoing under the laws of any jurisdiction;

"Secured Liabilities" means all present and future moneys, debts and liabilities due, owing or incurred by the Issuer to the Issuer Secured Creditors;

"SOFR" means, in respect of any Business Day, a reference rate equal to the daily Secured Overnight Financing Rate as provided by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, as the administrator of such rate (or any successor administrator of such rate) on the New York Fed's Website, in each case on or about 5:00p.m. (New York City Time) on the Business Day immediately following such Business Day.

"SONIA" means, in respect of any Business Day, a reference rate equal to the daily Sterling Overnight Index Average rate for such Business Day as provided by the administrator of SONIA to authorised distributors and as then published on the Relevant Screen Page or, if the Relevant Screen Page is unavailable, as otherwise published by such authorised distributors in each case on the Business Day immediately following such Business Day.

"Specified Currency" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Specified Denomination(s)" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Specified Office" has the meaning given in the Agency Agreement;

"Specified Period" has the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement;

"Standard & Poor's" means Standard & Poor's Rating Services or any successor thereof;

"**Subsidiary**" means, in relation to the Issuer, any company:

- (i) in which the Issuer holds a majority of the voting rights; or
- (ii) of which the Issuer is a member and has the right to appoint or remove a majority of the board of directors; or
- (iii) of which the Issuer is a member and controls a majority of the voting rights, and includes any company which is Subsidiary of a Subsidiary of the Issuer.

"TARGET2" means the Trans-European Automated Real-Time Gross Settlement Express Transfer payment system which utilises a single shared platform and which was launched on 19 November 2007;

"TARGET Settlement Day" means any day on which TARGET2 is open for the settlement of payments in euro;

"Transaction Documents" means the Trust Deed, the Issuer Deed of Charge, the

Agency Agreement, and the Servicer Agreement;

"Uncertificated Regulations" means the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001 (SI2001 No. 3755) including any modification thereof for the time being in force; and

"Zero Coupon Note" means a Note specified as such in the relevant Pricing Supplement.

- (b) *Interpretation*: In these Conditions:
 - (i) if the Notes are Zero Coupon Notes, references to Coupons and Couponholders are not applicable;
 - (ii) any reference to principal shall be deemed to include the Redemption Amount, any additional amounts in respect of principal which may be payable under Condition 11 (*Taxation*), any premium payable in respect of a Note and any other amount in the nature of principal payable pursuant to these Conditions;
 - (iii) any reference to interest shall be deemed to include any additional amounts in respect of interest which may be payable under Condition 11 (*Taxation*) and any other amount in the nature of interest payable pursuant to these Conditions;
 - (iv) references to Notes being "outstanding" shall be construed in accordance with the Trust Deed;
 - (v) if an expression is stated in Condition 2(a) (*Definitions*) to have the meaning given in the relevant Pricing Supplement, but the relevant Pricing Supplement gives no such meaning or specifies that such expression is "not applicable" then such expression is not applicable to the Notes; and
 - (vi) any reference to the Trust Deed or the Agency Agreement shall be construed as a reference to the Trust Deed or the Agency Agreement, as the case may be, as amended and/or supplemented up to and including the Issue Date of the Notes.

3. Form, Denomination and Title

- (a) *Notes*: Notes are in the Specified Denomination(s), which may include a minimum denomination specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement and higher integral multiples of a smaller amount specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement.
- (b) Title to Notes: The Registrar will maintain the register in accordance with the provisions of the Agency Agreement. Where applicable, a certificate (each, an "Individual Note Certificate") will be issued to each Holder of Notes in respect of its registered holding. Each Individual Note Certificate will be numbered serially with an identifying number which will be recorded in the Register. "Holder" means the person in whose name such Note is for the time being registered in the Register (or, in the case of a joint holding, the first named thereof) and "Noteholder" shall be construed accordingly.
 - Where specified to be issued as CREST Depository Interests in the applicable Pricing Supplement, indirect interests in the Notes shall be constituted and issued by the CREST Depository in accordance with the CREST Deed Poll. CDIs will be issued and settled through CREST.
- (c) Where specified to be issued as CREST Securities in the applicable Pricing Supplement, the Notes shall be held in uncertificated registered form in accordance with the Uncertificated Regulations and as such are not constituted by any physical document

of title. The CREST Agent on behalf of the Registrar shall maintain a record of uncertificated corporate securities (the "Record"). CREST Securities shall be cleared through CREST and are participating securities for the purposes of the Uncertificated Regulations.

- (d) Ownership: The Holder of any Note or Coupon shall (except as otherwise required by law) be treated as its absolute owner for all purposes (whether or not it is overdue and regardless of any notice of ownership, trust or any other interest therein, any writing on the Individual Note Certificate relating thereto (other than the endorsed form of transfer) or any notice of any previous loss or theft thereof) and no Person shall be liable for so treating such Holder. No Person shall have any right to enforce any term or condition of any Note under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999.
- (e) Transfers of Notes: Subject to paragraphs (g) (Closed periods) and (h) (Regulations concerning transfers and registration) below and to the conditions set forth in the Agency Agreement, a Note may be transferred upon surrender of the relevant Individual Note Certificate, with the endorsed form of transfer duly completed, at the Specified Office of the Registrar or any Transfer Agent, together with such evidence as the Registrar or (as the case may be) such Transfer Agent may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor and the authority of the individuals who have executed the form of transfer; provided, however, that a Note may not be transferred unless the principal amount of Notes transferred and (where not all of the Notes held by a Holder are being transferred) the principal amount of the balance of Notes not transferred are Specified Denominations. Where not all the Notes represented by the surrendered Individual Note Certificate are the subject of the transfer, a new Individual Note Certificate in respect of the balance of the Notes will be issued to the transferor.

Transfers of CREST Securities are effected upon registration of the transfer to a CREST account and all transfers are subject to and made in accordance with the Uncertificated Regulations and the rules, procedures and practices in effect of the Registrar, any Transfer Agent and CREST.

Transfers of CREST Securities will be effected without charge by or on behalf of the Issuer, the Operator or the CREST Agent, but upon payment of any Taxes that may be imposed in relation to them (or the giving of such indemnity as the Issuer, the Operator or the CREST Agent may require).

CREST Securities may not be transferred in or into the United States or to, or for the account or benefit of, US Persons (as defined in Regulation S under the Securities Act)(I) unless the CREST Securities are registered under the Securities Act, or an exemption from the registration requirements of the Securities Act is available, or (II) in a manner that would require the Issuer of the Securities to register under the US Investment Company Act.

(f) Registration and delivery of Individual Note Certificates: Within five business days of the surrender of an Individual Note Certificate in accordance with paragraph (f) (Transfers of Notes) above, the Registrar will register the transfer in question and deliver a new Individual Note Certificate of a like principal amount to the Notes transferred to each relevant Holder at its Specified Office or (as the case may be) the Specified Office of any Transfer Agent or (at the request and risk of any such relevant Holder) by uninsured first class mail (airmail if overseas) to the address specified for the purpose by such relevant Holder. In this paragraph, "business day" means a day on which commercial banks are open for general business (including dealings in

- foreign currencies) in the city where the Registrar or (as the case may be) the relevant Transfer Agent has its Specified Office.
- (g) No charge: The transfer of a Note will be effected without charge by or on behalf of the Issuer or the Registrar or any Transfer Agent but against such indemnity as the Registrar or (as the case may be) such Transfer Agent may require in respect of any tax or other duty of whatsoever nature which may be levied or imposed in connection with such transfer.
- (h) Closed periods: Noteholders may not require transfers to be registered during the period of 15 days ending on the due date for any payment of principal or interest in respect of the Notes.
- (i) Regulations concerning transfers and registration: All transfers of Notes and entries on the Register are subject to the detailed regulations concerning the transfer of Notes scheduled to the Agency Agreement. The regulations may be changed by the Issuer with the prior written approval of the Registrar.

4. Status and Application of Moneys

- (a) Status: The Notes and Coupons constitute secured obligations of the Issuer which will at all times rank pari passu and without preference among themselves.
- (b) Application of Moneys: Prior to the occurrence of an Event of Default, all funds standing to the credit of the Collateral Account for a Series shall be applied in payment, in the amounts required, in the following order of priority (in each case only if and to the extent that payments due of a higher priority have been made in full) and in each case together with VAT thereon (if payable) on each date that a payment falls due:
 - (i) first, in or towards satisfaction of (x) the costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) and any other amounts incurred by the Trustee in preparing and executing the trusts and performing any obligations under the Transaction Documents; (y) the costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) and any other amounts payable to any Receiver, including in the case of either the Trustee or a Receiver the costs of enforcing and/or realising any Security;
 - (ii) second, in or towards satisfaction of the costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) and any other amounts payable to the Agents under the Transaction Documents or otherwise and any other amounts, costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) by the Issuer;
 - third, pro rata and pari passu to the Noteholders in or towards payment of or discharge of all amounts of interest then due and payable under or in respect of the Notes of that Series;
 - (iv) fourth, pro rata and pari passu to the Noteholders in or towards payment of or discharge of all amounts of principal then due and payable under or in respect of the Notes of that Series; and
 - (v) fifth, the Issuer shall retain the balance (if any) in the Collateral Account to reimburse the Servicer for discharging fees and expenses relating to that Series or any other Series to the extent paid by the Servicer and, thereafter, in or towards satisfaction of any amounts due in relation to that Series or any other Series.

- (c) Post Enforcement Application of Moneys: Subject to Condition 17 (Enforcement), following the occurrence of an Event of Default all funds standing to the credit of the Collateral Account for a Series shall be applied in payment, in the amounts required, in the following order of priority (in each case only if and to the extent that payments, which are either due or which may become due, of a higher priority have been made in full) and in each case together with VAT thereon (if payable) on each date that a payment falls due:
 - (i) first, in or towards satisfaction of (x) the costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) and any other amounts incurred by the Trustee in preparing and executing the trusts and performing any obligations under the Transaction Documents; (y) the costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) and any other amounts payable to any Receiver, including in the case of either the Trustee or a Receiver the costs of enforcing and/or realising any Security;
 - (ii) second, in or towards satisfaction of the costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) and any other amounts payable to the Agents under the Transaction Documents or otherwise and any other amounts, costs, expenses, fees or other remuneration and indemnity payments (if any) by the Issuer;
 - third, pro rata and pari passu to the Noteholders in or towards payment of or discharge of all amounts of interest then due and payable under or in respect of the Notes of that Series;
 - (iv) fourth, pro rata and pari passu to the Noteholders in or towards payment of or discharge of all amounts of principal then due and payable under or in respect of the Notes of that Series; and
 - (v) fifth, in or towards satisfaction of the reimbursement of the Servicer for discharging fees and expenses relating to that Series or any other Series to the extent paid by the Servicer and, thereafter, to discharge undischarged fees and expenses of the Issuer.
- (d) Accounts: The Issuer shall, prior to the Issue Date, establish the Collateral Account.
- (e) Collateral Account: The net proceeds of the issuance of the Notes of a Series and all collections on the Secured Assets will be deposited into the Collateral Account for such Series.
- (f) Determination and payment of amounts: The Calculation Agent will, on the basis of a report prepared by the Servicer, calculate the amounts payable from the Collateral Account on the applicable dates as and when such amounts fall due and will notify the Issuer and the Trustee of each of such amounts.

5. Security and Covenants

- (a) Grant of Security: In relation to each Series, the Trustee, the Noteholders and the other Issuer Secured Creditors of such Series will share in the benefit of the Security granted in respect of such Series. The Security is granted by the Issuer under the Trust Deed and the Issuer Deed of Charge in the favour of the Trustee, on trust for and on behalf of itself, the Noteholders and the other Issuer Secured Creditors on the terms of the Trust Deed and the Issuer Deed of Charge, as security for the Secured Liabilities.
- (b) Security: The Security in relation to a Series comprises of:

- (i) an assignment by way of first fixed security of all of its right, title, benefit and interest, present and future, in, to and under each of the Transaction Documents to the extent that they relate to such Series;
- (ii) an assignment by way of first fixed security of all of its right, title, benefit and interest, present and future, in, to and under each Borrower Loan Agreement, each Borrower Deed of Charge and each Financial Collateral Asset relating to such Series;
- (iii) a first fixed charge of all monies from time to time standing to the credit of any segregated bank account with any bank, financial institution or other person opened in respect of such Series, together with all other rights and benefits accruing to or arising in connection with each account (including, but not limited to, entitlements to interest);
- (iv) a first fixed charge of all its rights in respect of each Transaction Document, each Borrower Loan Agreement, each Borrower Deed of Charge and each Financial Collateral Asset, in each case relating to such Series, to the extent not effectively assigned under Condition 5(a)(i) or (ii) above; and
- (v) a floating charge of all monies from time to time standing to the credit of any segregated bank account with any bank, financial institution or other person opened in respect of such Series, together with all other rights and benefits accruing to or arising in connection with each account (including, but not limited to, entitlements to interest) and a floating charge of all its rights in respect of each Transaction Document, each Borrower Loan Agreement, each Borrower Deed of Charge and each Financial Collateral Asset, in each case relating to such Series, in each case to the extent not effectively assigned under Condition 5(a)(i) or (ii) above or charged under 5(a)(iii) or (iv) above.

6. Fixed Rate Note Provisions

- (a) Application: This Condition 6 is applicable to the Notes only if the Fixed Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable.
- (b) Accrual of interest: The Notes bear interest from the Interest Commencement Date at the Rate of Interest payable in arrear on each Interest Payment Date, subject as provided in Condition 10 (Payments) and Condition 23 (Limited Recourse and Non-Petition). Subject to Condition 23 (Limited Recourse and Non-Petition), each Note will cease to bear interest from the due date for final redemption unless, upon due presentation, payment of the Redemption Amount is improperly withheld or refused, in which case it will continue to bear interest in accordance with this Condition 6(b) (as well after as before judgment) until whichever is the earlier of (i) the day on which all sums due in respect of such Note up to that day are received by or on behalf of the relevant Noteholder and (ii) the day which is seven days after the Paying Agent or the Trustee has notified the Noteholders that it has received all sums due in respect of the Notes up to such seventh day (except to the extent that there is any subsequent default in payment).
- (c) Fixed Coupon Amount: The amount of interest payable in respect of each Note for any Interest Period shall be the relevant Fixed Coupon Amount and, if the Notes are in more than one Specified Denomination, shall be the relevant Fixed Coupon Amount in respect of the relevant Specified Denomination.
- (d) Calculation of interest amount: The amount of interest payable in respect of each Note for any period for which a Fixed Coupon Amount is not specified shall be calculated

by applying the Rate of Interest to the Calculation Amount, multiplying the product by the relevant Day Count Fraction, rounding the resulting figure to the nearest sub-unit of the Specified Currency (half a sub-unit being rounded upwards) and multiplying such rounded figure by a fraction equal to the Specified Denomination of such Note divided by the Calculation Amount. For this purpose a "sub-unit" means, in the case of any currency other than euro, the lowest amount of such currency that is available as legal tender in the country of such currency and, in the case of euro, means one cent.

7. Floating Rate Note Provisions

- (a) Application: This Condition 7 is applicable to the Notes only if the Floating Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable.
- (b) Accrual of interest: The Notes bear interest from the Interest Commencement Date at the Rate of Interest payable in arrear on each Interest Payment Date, subject as provided in Condition 10 (Payments) and Condition 23 (Limited Recourse and Non-Petition). Subject to Condition 23 (Limited Recourse and Non-Petition), each Note will cease to bear interest from the due date for final redemption unless, upon due presentation, payment of the Redemption Amount is improperly withheld or refused, in which case it will continue to bear interest in accordance with this Condition (as well after as before judgment) until whichever is the earlier of (i) the day on which all sums due in respect of such Note up to that day are received by or on behalf of the relevant Noteholder and (ii) the day which is seven days after the Paying Agent has notified the Noteholders that it has received all sums due in respect of the Notes up to such seventh day (except to the extent that there is any subsequent default in payment).
- (c) Screen Rate Determination: If Screen Rate Determination is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as the manner in which the Rate(s) of Interest is/are to be determined, the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes for each Interest Period will be determined by the Calculation Agent on the following basis:
 - (i) if the Reference Rate is a composite quotation or customarily supplied by one entity, the Calculation Agent will determine the Reference Rate which appears on the Relevant Screen Page as of the Relevant Time on the relevant Interest Determination Date;
 - (ii) in any other case, the Calculation Agent will determine the arithmetic mean of the Reference Rates which appear on the Relevant Screen Page as of the Relevant Time on the relevant Interest Determination Date;
 - (iii) if, in the case of (i) above, such rate does not appear on that page or, in the case of (ii) above, fewer than two such rates appear on that page or if, in either case, the Relevant Screen Page is unavailable, the Calculation Agent will request the principal Relevant Financial Centre office of each of the Reference Banks to provide a quotation of the Reference Rate at approximately the Relevant Time on the Interest Determination Date to prime banks in the Relevant Financial Centre interbank market in an amount that is representative for a single transaction in that market at that time; and determine the arithmetic mean of such quotations; and
 - (iv) if fewer than two such quotations are provided as requested, the Calculation Agent will determine the arithmetic mean of the rates (being the nearest to the Reference Rate, as determined by the Calculation Agent) quoted by major banks in the Principal Financial Centre of the Specified Currency, selected by

the Calculation Agent, at approximately 11.00 a.m. (local time in the Principal Financial Centre of the Specified Currency) on the first day of the relevant Interest Period for loans in the Specified Currency to leading European banks for a period equal to the relevant Interest Period and in an amount that is representative for a single transaction in that market at that time,

and the Rate of Interest for such Interest Period shall be the sum of the Margin and the rate or (as the case may be) the arithmetic mean so determined; **provided, however, that** if the Calculation Agent is unable to determine a rate or (as the case may be) an arithmetic mean in accordance with the above provisions in relation to any Interest Period, the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes during such Interest Period will be the sum of the Margin and the rate or (as the case may be) the arithmetic mean last determined in relation to the Notes in respect of a preceding Interest Period.

- (d) Alternative Reference Rates: If Alternative Reference Rates is specified as applicable in the relevant Final Terms and notwithstanding the provisions of Condition 7(c) (Screen Rate Determination), if the Issuer (in consultation with the Calculation Agent) determines that the Reference Rate specified in the relevant Final Terms has ceased to be published on the Relevant Screen Page as a result of such Reference Rate ceasing to be calculated or administered, then the following provisions shall apply:
 - (i) the Issuer shall use reasonable endeavours to appoint an Independent Adviser to determine an alternative rate (the "Alternative Reference Rate") and an alternative screen page or source (the "Alternative Relevant Screen Page") no later than five Business Days prior to the Interest Determination Date relating to the next Interest Period (the "IA Determination Cut-off Date") for the purposes of determining the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes for all future Interest Periods (subject to the subsequent operation of this Condition 7(d));
 - (ii) the Alternative Reference Rate shall be such rate as the independent adviser determines has replaced the relevant Reference Rate in customary market usage for the purposes of determining floating rates of interest in respect of Eurobonds denominated in the Specified Currency, or, if the Independent Adviser determines that there is no such rate, such other rate as the Independent Adviser determines in its sole discretion is most comparable to the relevant Reference Rate, and the Alternative Relevant Screen Page shall be such page of an information service as displays the Alternative Reference Rate;
 - (iii) if the Issuer is unable to appoint an Independent Adviser or the Independent Adviser appointed by it fails to determine an Alternative Reference Rate and Alternative Relevant Screen Page prior to the IA Determination Cut-off Date, then the Issuer (in consultation with the Calculation Agent and acting in good faith and a commercially reasonable manner) shall determine which (if any) rate has replaced the relevant Reference Rate in customary market usage for purposes of determining floating rates of interest in respect of Eurobonds denominated in the Specified Currency, or, if it determines that there is no such rate, which (if any) rate is most comparable to the relevant Reference Rate, and the Alternative Reference Rate shall be the rate so determined by the Issuer and the Alternative Relevant Screen Page shall be such page of an information service as displays the Alternative Reference Rate; provided, however, that if this Condition 7(d)(iii) applies and the Issuer is unable to determine an Alternative Reference Rate and Alternative Relevant Screen Page prior to the Interest Determination Date relating to the next Interest Period,

- the Rate of Interest applicable to such Interest Period shall be equal to the sum of the Margin and the rate last determined in relation to the Notes in respect of a preceding Interest Period;
- (iv) if an Alternative Reference Rate and Alternative Relevant Screen Page is determined in accordance with the preceding provisions, such Alternative Reference Rate and Alternative Relevant Screen Page shall be the Reference Rate and the Relevant Screen Page in relation to the Notes for all future Interest Periods (subject to the subsequent operation of this Condition 7(d));
- (v) if the Independent Adviser or, in accordance with Condition 7(d)(iii) above, the Issuer determines an Alternative Reference Rate in accordance with the above provisions, the Independent Adviser or the Issuer (as the case may be) may also, following consultation with the Calculation Agent, specify changes to the Relevant Time, Relevant Financial Centre, Reference Banks, Relevant Number of Quotations, Leading Banks, Day Count Fraction, Business Day Convention, Business Days and/or Interest Determination Date applicable to the Notes, and the method for determining the Rate of Interest in relation to the Notes if the Alternative Reference Rate is not available, or fewer than the required number of rates appear, on the Alternative Relevant Screen Page at any time, in order to follow market practice in relation to the Alternative Reference Rate, and shall also specify any other changes (including to the Margin) which the Issuer, following consultation with the Independent Adviser (where appointed), determines in good faith are reasonably necessary to ensure the proper operation and comparability to the Reference Rate of the Alternative Reference Rate, which changes shall apply to the Notes for all future Interest Periods (subject to the subsequent operation of this Condition 7(d)) and, for the avoidance of doubt, the Trustee shall, at the direction and expense of the Issuer, and having received a certificate from the Issuer, signed by two Authorised Signatories, confirming that the Issuer or the Independent Adviser has made the relevant determinations in accordance with this Condition 7(d) and attaching the proposed amendments to the Conditions to effect such amendments to the Conditions together with such consequential amendments to the Trust Deed and Agency Agreement as the Trustee may deem appropriate in order to give effect to this Condition 7(d) and the Trustee shall not be liable to any person for any consequences thereof, save as provided in the Trust Deed. No consent of the Holders of the Notes of the relevant Series or of the Holders of the Coupons appertaining thereto shall be required in connection with effecting the Alternative Reference Rate, Alternative Relevant Screen Page or such other changes, including for the execution of any documents or the taking of other steps by the Trustee, the Issuer or any of the parties to the Agency Agreement (if required)). The Trustee shall not be obliged to agree to any amendments which in the sole opinion of the Trustee would have the effect of (A) exposing the Trustee to any liabilities against which it has not been indemnified and/or secured and/or pre-funded to its satisfaction or (B) increasing the obligations or duties, or decreasing the rights or protection, of the Trustee in the documents to which it is a party and/or these Conditions; and
- (vi) the Issuer shall promptly following the determination of any Alternative Reference Rate and Alternative Relevant Screen Page give notice thereof and of any changes pursuant to Condition 7(d)(v) to the Trustee, the Principal

Paying Agent, the Calculation Agent and the Noteholders (in accordance with Condition 19 (Notices)).

- (e) ISDA Determination: If ISDA Determination is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as the manner in which the Rate(s) of Interest is/are to be determined, the Rate of Interest applicable to the Notes for each Interest Period will be the sum of the Margin and the relevant ISDA Rate where "ISDA Rate" in relation to any Interest Period means a rate equal to the Floating Rate (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) that would be determined by the Calculation Agent under an interest rate swap transaction if the Calculation Agent were acting as Calculation Agent for that interest rate swap transaction under the terms of an agreement incorporating the ISDA Definitions and under which:
 - (i) the Floating Rate Option (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) is as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement;
 - (ii) the Designated Maturity (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) is a period specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement; and
 - (iii) the relevant Reset Date (as defined in the ISDA Definitions) is either (A) if the relevant Floating Rate Option is based on the London inter-bank offered rate (LIBOR) for a currency, the first day of that Interest Period or (B) in any other case, as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement.
- (f) Maximum or Minimum Rate of Interest: If any Maximum Rate of Interest or Minimum Rate of Interest is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, then the Rate of Interest shall in no event be greater than the maximum or be less than the minimum so specified. Unless otherwise stated in the applicable Pricing Supplement, the Minimum Rate of Interest shall be deemed to be zero.
- (g) Calculation of Interest Amount: The Calculation Agent will, as soon as practicable after the time at which the Rate of Interest is to be determined in relation to each Interest Period, calculate the Interest Amount payable in respect of each Note for such Interest Period. The Interest Amount will be calculated by applying the Rate of Interest for such Interest Period to the Calculation Amount, multiplying the product by the relevant Day Count Fraction, rounding the resulting figure to the nearest sub-unit of the Specified Currency (half a sub-unit being rounded upwards) and multiplying such rounded figure by a fraction equal to the Specified Denomination of the relevant Note divided by the Calculation Amount. For this purpose a "sub-unit" means, in the case of any currency other than euro, the lowest amount of such currency that is available as legal tender in the country of such currency and, in the case of euro, means one cent.
- (h) Publication: The Calculation Agent will cause each Rate of Interest and Interest Amount determined by it, together with the relevant Interest Payment Date, and any other amount(s) required to be determined by it together with any relevant payment date(s) to be notified to the Paying Agents and each competent authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system (if any) by which the Notes have then been admitted to listing, trading and/or quotation as soon as practicable after such determination but (in the case of each Rate of Interest, Interest Amount and Interest Payment Date) in any event not later than the fourth London Business Day thereafter. Notice thereof shall also promptly be given to the Noteholders. For the purposes of this paragraph (g) the expression "London Business Day" means a day (other than a Saturday or Sunday) on which banks and foreign exchange markets are open for business in London. The Calculation Agent will be entitled to recalculate any Interest

Amount (on the basis of the foregoing provisions) without notice in the event of an extension or shortening of the relevant Interest Period. If the Calculation Amount is less than the minimum Specified Denomination the Calculation Agent shall not be obliged to publish each Interest Amount but instead may publish only the Calculation Amount and the Interest Amount in respect of a Note having the minimum Specified Denomination.

- (i) Notifications etc.: All notifications, opinions, determinations, certificates, calculations, quotations and decisions given, expressed, made or obtained for the purposes of this Condition 7 by the Calculation Agent will (in the absence of manifest error) be binding on the Issuer, the Paying Agents, the Noteholders and the Couponholders and (in the absence of wilful default) no liability to any such Person will attach to the Calculation Agent in connection with the exercise or non-exercise by it of its powers, duties and discretions for such purposes.
- (j) All certificates, communications, opinions, determinations, calculations, quotations and decisions given, expressed, made or obtained for the purposes of the provisions of this Condition 7 by the Calculation Agent or the Trustee, as the case may be, shall (in the absence of manifest error) be binding on the Issuer, the Paying Agents and all Noteholders and Couponholders and (in the absence of wilful default) no liability to the Issuer, the Noteholders or the Couponholders shall attach to the Calculation Agent or the Trustee in connection with the exercise or non–exercise by it of its powers, duties and discretions pursuant to such provisions.

8. Zero Coupon Note Provisions

- (a) Application: This Condition 8 is applicable to the Notes only if the Zero Coupon Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable.
- (b) Late payment on Zero Coupon Notes: If the Redemption Amount payable in respect of any Zero Coupon Note is improperly withheld or refused, the Redemption Amount shall thereafter be an amount equal to the sum of:
 - (i) the Reference Price; and
 - (ii) the product of the Accrual Yield (compounded annually) being applied to the Reference Price on the basis of the relevant Day Count Fraction from (and including) the Issue Date to (but excluding) whichever is the earlier of (i) the day on which all sums due in respect of such Note up to that day are received by or on behalf of the relevant Noteholder and (ii) the day which is seven days after the Paying Agent has notified the Noteholders that it has received all sums due in respect of the Notes up to such seventh day (except to the extent that there is any subsequent default in payment).

9. Redemption and Purchase

- (a) Scheduled redemption: Unless previously redeemed, or purchased and cancelled, the Notes will be redeemed at their Final Redemption Amount on:
 - (i) the Maturity Date in cases where all accrued interest has been paid or will be paid simultaneously with such redemption; or
 - (ii) the Longstop Maturity Date in all other cases, subject, in each case, as provided in Condition 10 (*Payments*).
- (b) Redemption for tax reasons: The Notes may be redeemed at the option of the Issuer in whole, but not in part:

- (i) at any time (if the Floating Rate Note Provisions are not specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable); or
- (ii) on any Interest Payment Date (if the Floating Rate Note Provisions are specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable),

on giving not less than 30 nor more than 60 days' notice to the Noteholders, the Trustee and the Paying Agent (which notice shall be irrevocable), at their Early Redemption Amount, together with interest accrued (if any) to the date fixed for redemption, if, immediately before giving such notice, the Issuer satisfies the Trustee that:

- (i) the Issuer has or will become obliged to pay additional amounts as provided or referred to in Condition 11 (*Taxation*) as a result of any change in, or amendment to, the laws or regulations of the United Kingdom or any political subdivision or any authority thereof or therein having power to tax, or any change in the application or official interpretation of such laws or regulations (including a holding by a court of competent jurisdiction), which change or amendment becomes effective on or after the date of issue of the first Tranche of the Notes; and
- (ii) such obligation cannot be avoided by the Issuer taking reasonable measures available to it,

provided, however, that no such notice of redemption shall be given earlier than:

- (A) where the Notes may be redeemed at any time, 90 days prior to the earliest date on which the Issuer would be obliged to pay such additional amounts if a payment in respect of the Notes were then due; or
- (B) where the Notes may be redeemed only on an Interest Payment Date, 60 days prior to the Interest Payment Date occurring immediately before the earliest date on which the Issuer would be obliged to pay such additional amounts if a payment in respect of the Notes were then due.

Prior to the publication of any notice of redemption pursuant to this paragraph, the Issuer shall deliver to the Trustee (a) if the Trustee so requests, an opinion of independent legal advisers to the effect that the Issuer has or will become obliged to pay such additional amounts as a result of such change or amendment, and (b) a certificate signed by two directors of the Issuer stating that the Issuer is entitled to effect such redemption and setting forth a statement of facts showing that the conditions precedent to the right of the Issuer so to redeem have occurred.

The Trustee shall be entitled to accept without liability such opinion and/ or such certificate as sufficient evidence of the satisfaction of the circumstances set out above, in which event it shall be conclusive and binding on the Noteholders and Couponholders.

Upon the expiry of any such notice as is referred to in this Condition 9(b), the Issuer shall be bound to redeem the Notes in accordance with this Condition 9(b).

(a) Redemption at the option of the Issuer: If the Call Option is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable, the Notes may be redeemed at the option of the Issuer in whole or, if so specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, in part on any Optional Redemption Date (Call) on the Issuer's giving not less than 30 nor more than 60 days' notice to the Noteholders, the Trustee and the Paying Agent, or such

other period(s) as may be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, (which notice shall be irrevocable and shall oblige the Issuer to redeem the Notes or, as the case may be, the Notes specified in such notice on the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Call)) at the applicable amount specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement (together, if appropriate, with interest accrued to (but excluding) the relevant Optional Redemption Date) being the Optional Redemption Amount (Call).

On the date specified for redemption in the notice given by the Issuer, the Issuer shall redeem the Notes as specified in the notice in accordance with this Condition 9(c).

All notifications, opinions, determinations, certifications, calculations, quotations and decisions given, expressed, made or obtained for the purposes of this Condition 9(c) by the Paying Agent, shall (in the absence of manifest error), be binding on the Issuer, the Paying Agent, the Trustee, the Paying Agents, the Registrar (if applicable) and all Noteholders and Couponholders.

- (c) Partial redemption: If the Notes are to be redeemed in part only on any date in accordance with Condition 9(c) (Redemption at the option of the Issuer), each Note shall be redeemed in part in the proportion which the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes to be redeemed on the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Call) bears to the aggregate principal amount of outstanding Notes on such date. If any Maximum Redemption Amount or Minimum Redemption Amount is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, then the Optional Redemption Amount (Call) shall in no event be greater than the maximum or be less than the minimum so specified.
- (d) Redemption at the option of Noteholders: If the Put Option is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement as being applicable, the Issuer shall, at the option of the holder of any Note redeem such Note on the Optional Redemption Date (Put) specified in the relevant Put Option Notice at the relevant Optional Redemption Amount (Put) together with interest (if any) accrued to such date. In order to exercise the option contained in this Condition 9(e), the holder of a Note must, not less than 30 nor more than 60 days before the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Put) (or such other period(s) as may be specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement), deposit with any Paying Agent such Note together with all unmatured Coupons relating thereto and a duly completed Put Option Notice in the form obtainable from any Paying Agent. The Paying Agent with which a Note is so deposited shall deliver a duly completed Put Option Receipt to the depositing Noteholder. No Note, once deposited with a duly completed Put Option Notice in accordance with this Condition 9(e), may be withdrawn; provided, however, that if, prior to the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Put), any such Note becomes immediately due and payable or, upon due presentation of any such Note on the relevant Optional Redemption Date (Put), payment of the redemption moneys is improperly withheld or refused, the relevant Paying Agent shall mail notification thereof to the depositing Noteholder at such address as may have been given by such Noteholder in the relevant Put Option Notice and shall mail such Note by uninsured post to, and at the risk of, the Noteholder at such address as may have been given by such Noteholder in the relevant Put Option Notice. Notes may be redeemed under this Condition 9(e) in any multiple of their lowest Specified Denomination.
- (e) No other redemption: The Issuer shall not be entitled to redeem the Notes otherwise than as provided in paragraphs (a) to (e) above.
- (f) Early redemption of Zero Coupon Notes: Unless otherwise specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, the Redemption Amount payable on redemption of a Zero Coupon Note at any time before the Maturity Date or Longstop Maturity Date (as

applicable) shall be an amount equal to the sum of:

- (i) the Reference Price; and
- (ii) the product of the Accrual Yield (compounded annually) being applied to the Reference Price from (and including) the Issue Date to (but excluding) the date fixed for redemption or (as the case may be) the date upon which the Note becomes due and payable.

Where such calculation is to be made for a period which is not a whole number of years, the calculation in respect of the period of less than a full year shall be made on the basis of such Day Count Fraction as may be specified in the Pricing Supplement for the purposes of this Condition 9(g) or, if none is so specified, a Day Count Fraction of 30/360, Actual 360 or Actual 365 (Fixed).

- (g) Purchase: The Issuer or any of its Subsidiaries may at any time purchase Notes in the open market or otherwise and at any price, provided that all unmatured Coupons are purchased therewith.
- (h) Cancellation: All Notes so redeemed or purchased by the Issuer or any of its Subsidiaries and any unmatured Coupons attached to or surrendered with them shall be cancelled and may not be reissued or resold.

10. Payments

(a) Principal: Payments of principal shall be made by cheque drawn in the currency in which the payment is due drawn on, or, upon application by a Holder of a Global Registered Note to the Specified Office of the Paying Agent not later than the fifteenth day before the due date for any such payment, by transfer to an account denominated in that currency (or, if that currency is euro, any other account to which euro may be credited or transferred) and maintained by the payee with, a bank in the Principal Financial Centre of that currency (in the case of a sterling cheque, a town clearing branch of a bank in the City of London) and (in the case of redemption) upon surrender (or, in the case of part payment only, endorsement) of the relevant Individual Note Certificates at the Specified Office of any Paying Agent.

Where specified to be issued as CREST Securities in the applicable Pricing Supplement, the Notes, payments in respect of CREST Securities shall be made to the relevant Holder's cash memorandum account for value on the Relevant Date, such payment to be made in accordance with the regulations of CREST.

Each of the persons shown in the Record as the Holder of a particular nominal amount of CREST Securities must look solely to the settlement bank or institution at which its cash memorandum account is held for its share of each such payment so made by or on behalf of the Issuer.

(b) Interest: Payments of interest shall be made by cheque drawn in the currency in which the payment is due drawn on, or, upon application by a Holder of a Global Registered Note to the Specified Office of the Paying Agent not later than the fifteenth day before the due date for any such payment, by transfer to an account denominated in that currency (or, if that currency is euro, any other account to which euro may be credited or transferred) and maintained by the payee with, a bank in the Principal Financial Centre of that currency (in the case of a sterling cheque, a town clearing branch of a bank in the City of London) and (in the case of interest payable on redemption) upon surrender (or, in the case of part payment only, endorsement) of the relevant Individual Note Certificates at the Specified Office of any Paying Agent.

Where specified to be issued as CREST Securities in the applicable Pricing Supplement, the Notes, payments in respect of CREST Securities shall be made to the relevant Holder's cash memorandum account for value on the Relevant Date, such payment to be made in accordance with the regulations of CREST.

Each of the persons shown in the Record as the Holder of a particular nominal amount of CREST Securities must look solely to the settlement bank or institution at which its cash memorandum account is held for its share of each such payment so made by or on behalf of the Issuer

- (c) Payments subject to fiscal laws: All payments in respect of the Notes will be subject in all cases to (i) any applicable fiscal or other laws and regulations in the place of payment, but without prejudice to the provisions of Condition 11 (Taxation) and (ii) any withholding or deduction required pursuant to an agreement described in Section 1471(b) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code") or otherwise imposed pursuant to Sections 1471 through 1474 (inclusive) of the Code, any regulations or agreements thereunder, official interpretations thereof, or any law implementing an intergovernmental approach thereto.
- (d) Payments on business days: Where payment is to be made by transfer to an account, payment instructions (for value the due date, or, if the due date is not Payment Business Day, for value the next succeeding Payment Business Day) will be initiated and, where payment is to be made by cheque, the cheque will be mailed (i) (in the case of payments of principal and interest payable on redemption) on the later of the due date for payment and the day on which the relevant Individual Note Certificate is surrendered (or, in the case of part payment only, endorsed) at the Specified Office of a Paying Agent and (ii) (in the case of payments of interest payable other than on redemption) on the due date for payment. A Holder of a Global Registered Note shall not be entitled to any interest or other payment in respect of any delay in payment resulting from (A) the due date for a payment not being a Payment Business Day or (B) a cheque mailed in accordance with this Condition 10 arriving after the due date for payment or being lost in the mail.
- (e) Partial payments: If a Paying Agent makes a partial payment in respect of any Global Registered Note, the Issuer shall procure that the amount and date of such payment are noted on the Register and, in the case of partial payment upon presentation of a Individual Note Certificate, that a statement indicating the amount and the date of such payment is endorsed on the relevant Individual Note Certificate.
- (f) Record date: Each payment in respect of a Note will be made to the person shown as the Holder in the Register at the opening of business in the place of the Registrar's Specified Office on the fifteenth day before the due date for such payment (the "Record Date"). Where payment in respect of a Global Registered Note is to be made by cheque, the cheque will be mailed to the address shown as the address of the Holder in the Register at the opening of business on the relevant Record Date.

11. Taxation

(a) Gross up: All payments of principal and interest in respect of the Notes and the Coupons by or on behalf of the Issuer shall be made free and clear of, and without withholding or deduction for or on account of, any present or future taxes, duties, assessments or governmental charges of whatever nature imposed, levied, collected, withheld or assessed by or on behalf of the United Kingdom or any political subdivision therein or any authority therein or thereof having power to tax, unless the withholding or deduction of such taxes, duties, assessments, or governmental charges

is required by law. In that event, the Issuer shall pay such additional amounts as will result in receipt by the Noteholders and the Couponholders after such withholding or deduction of such amounts as would have been received by them had no such withholding or deduction been required, except that no such additional amounts shall be payable in respect of any Note or Coupon presented for payment:

- (i) by or on behalf of a holder which is liable to such taxes, duties, assessments or governmental charges in respect of such Note or Coupon by reason of its having some connection with the jurisdiction by which such taxes, duties, assessments or charges have been imposed, levied, collected, withheld or assessed other than the mere holding of the Note or Coupon; or
- (ii) where such withholding or deduction is imposed on a payment to an individual and is required to be made pursuant to European Council Directive 2003/48/EC on the taxation of savings income or any law implementing or complying with, or introduced in order to conform to, this Directive; or
- (iii) by or on behalf of a holder who would have been able to avoid such withholding or deduction by presenting the relevant Note or Coupon to another Paying Agent in a Member State of the EU; or
- (iv) more than 30 days after the Relevant Date except to the extent that the holder of such Note or Coupon would have been entitled to such additional amounts on presenting such Note or Coupon for payment on the last day of such period of 30 days.
- (b) Taxing jurisdiction: If the Issuer becomes subject at any time to any taxing jurisdiction other than the United Kingdom references in these Conditions to the United Kingdom shall be construed as references to the United Kingdom and/or such other jurisdiction.

12. Events of Default

If any of the following events occurs and is continuing, the Trustee at its discretion may and, if so requested in writing by holders of at least one-quarter of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes or if so directed by an Extraordinary Resolution, shall (subject to the Trustee having been indemnified and/or prefunded and/or provided with security to its satisfaction) give written notice to the Issuer declaring the Notes to be immediately due and payable, whereupon they shall become immediately due and payable at their Early Termination Amount together with accrued interest without further action or formality:

- (a) subject to Condition 23 (*Limited Recourse and Non-Petition*), if default is made in the payment of any principal or interest due in respect of the Notes or any of them and the default continues for a period of 7 days in the case of principal and 14 days in the case of interest; or
- (b) if the Issuer fails to perform or observe any of its other obligations under the Conditions or the Trust Deed and (except in any case where, in the opinion of the Trustee, the failure is incapable of remedy when no such continuation or notice as is hereinafter mentioned will be required) the failure continues for the period of 30 days (or such longer period as the Trustee may agree) next following the service by the Trustee on the Issuer of notice requiring the same to be remedied; or
- (c) if:

- (i) any Indebtedness of the Issuer becomes due and repayable prematurely by reason of an event of default (however described); or
- (ii) the Issuer fails to make any payment in respect of any Indebtedness on the due date for payment as extended by any applicable grace period; or
- (iii) default is made by the Issuer in making any payment due under any guarantee and/or indemnity given by it in relation to any Indebtedness of any other person on the due date for payment as extended by any applicable grace period,

provided that no event described in this subparagraph (c) shall constitute an Event of Default unless the relevant amount of Indebtedness or guarantee and/or indemnity given by it in relation to any Indebtedness, either alone or when aggregated (without duplication) with other amounts of Indebtedness and/or guarantee and/or indemnity given by it in relation to any Indebtedness relative to all (if any) other events specified in (i) to (iii) above which have occurred and are continuing, amounts to at least £500,000 (or its equivalent in any other currency).

A certificate or report by two directors of the Issuer whether or not addressed to the Trustee that in their opinion the £500,000 (or its equivalent in any other currency) mentioned in the proviso to (c) above has been reached may be relied upon by the Trustee without liability and without further enquiry or evidence and, if relied upon by the Trustee, shall, in the absence of manifest error, be conclusive and binding on all parties; or

- (d) if any order is made by any competent court or resolution passed for the winding up or dissolution of the Issuer save for the purposes of or pursuant to an amalgamation, reorganisation or restructuring whilst solvent or on terms previously approved in writing by the Trustee or by an Extraordinary Resolution; or
- (e) if the Issuer ceases to carry on all or substantially all of its business, save for the purposes of or pursuant to an amalgamation, reorganisation or restructuring whilst solvent or on terms previously approved in writing by the Trustee or by an Extraordinary Resolution, or the Issuer is unable to pay its debts (or any class of its debts) as they fall due, or is deemed unable to pay its debts pursuant to or for the purposes of any applicable law, or is adjudicated or found bankrupt or insolvent; or
- (f) if (A) proceedings are initiated against the Issuer under any applicable liquidation, insolvency, composition, or other similar laws, or an application is made (or documents filed with a court) for the appointment of an administrative or other receiver, manager, administrator or other similar official, or an administrative or other receiver, manager, administrator or other similar official is appointed, in relation to the Issuer in relation to the whole or a substantial part of the undertaking or its assets, or an encumbrancer takes possession of the whole or a substantial part of the undertaking or its assets, or a distress, execution, attachment, sequestration or other process is levied, enforced upon, sued out or put in force against the whole or a substantial part of the undertaking or its assets and (B) in any case is not being contested in good faith by the Issuer or is not discharged or stayed within 45 days; or
- (g) if the Issuer initiates or consents to judicial proceedings relating to itself under any applicable liquidation, insolvency, composition, or other similar laws (including the obtaining of a moratorium) or makes a conveyance or assignment for the benefit of, or enters into any composition or other arrangement with, its creditors generally (or any class of its creditors) or any meeting is convened to consider a proposal for an arrangement or composition with its creditors generally (or any class of its creditors)

otherwise than for the purposes of or pursuant to an amalgamation, reorganisation or restructuring whilst solvent or on terms previously approved in writing by the Trustee or by an Extraordinary Resolution.

13. Prescription

Claims for principal and interest on redemption in respect of Notes shall become void unless the relevant Individual Note Certificates are surrendered for payment within ten years of the appropriate Relevant Date.

14. Replacement of Notes or Coupons

If any Note, Individual Note Certificate or Coupon is lost, stolen, mutilated, defaced or destroyed, it may be replaced at the Specified Office of the Registrar (and, if the Notes are then admitted to listing, trading and/or quotation by any competent authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system which requires the appointment of a Paying Agent or Transfer Agent in any particular place, the Paying Agent or Transfer Agent having its Specified Office in the place required by such competent authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system), subject to all applicable laws and competent authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system requirements, upon payment by the claimant of the expenses incurred in connection with such replacement and on such terms as to evidence, security, indemnity and otherwise as the Issuer may reasonably require. Mutilated or defaced Notes, Individual Note Certificates or Coupons must be surrendered before replacements will be issued. This Condition 14 shall not apply to CREST Securities or CREST Depositary Interests.

15. Trustee and Agents

- (a) Under the Trust Deed, the Trustee is entitled to be indemnified and/or secured and/or prefunded and relieved from responsibility in certain circumstances and to be paid its costs and expenses in priority to the claims of the Noteholders. In addition, the Trustee is entitled to enter into business transactions with the Issuer and any entity relating to the Issuer without accounting for any profit.
- (b) The Trust Deed provides that, when determining whether an indemnity or any security or pre-funding is satisfactory to it, the Trustee shall be entitled (i) to evaluate its risk in any given circumstance by considering the worst-case scenario and (ii) to require that any indemnity or security given to it by the Noteholders or any of them be given on a joint and several basis and be supported by evidence satisfactory to it as to the financial standing and creditworthiness of each counterparty and/or as to the value of the security and an opinion as to the capacity, power and authority of each counterparty and/or the validity and effectiveness of the security.
- (c) In the exercise of its trusts, rights, powers and discretions under these Conditions and the Trust Deed, the Trustee will have regard to the general interests of the Noteholders as a class and will not have regard or be responsible for any consequence for individual Holders of Notes as a result of such Holders being connected in any way with a particular territory or taxing jurisdiction and the Trustee shall not be entitled to require, nor shall any Noteholder or Couponholder be entitled to claim, from the Issuer, the Trustee or any other person any indemnification or payment in respect of any tax consequence of any such exercise upon individual Noteholders or Couponholders except to the extent already provided for in Condition 11 (*Taxation*) and/or any undertaking given in addition to, or in substitution for, Condition 11 (*Taxation*) pursuant to the Trust Deed.
- (d) In acting under the Agency Agreement and in connection with the Notes and the

- Coupons, the Agents act solely as agents of the Issuer and (to the extent provided therein) the Trustee and do not assume any obligations towards or relationship of agency or trust for or with any of the Noteholders or Couponholders.
- (e) The initial Agents and their initial Specified Offices are listed below. The initial Calculation Agent (if any) is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement. The Issuer reserves the right (with the prior approval of the Trustee) at any time to vary or terminate the appointment of any Agent and to appoint a successor Paying Agent or Registrar or Calculation Agent and additional or successor Paying Agents in the manner specified in the Agency Agreement; provided, however, that:
 - (i) the Issuer shall at all times maintain a Paying Agent and a Registrar; and
 - (ii) the Issuer shall at all times maintain a paying agent in an EU member state that will not be obliged to withhold or deduct tax pursuant to European Council Directive 2003/48/EC; and
 - (iii) if a Calculation Agent is specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement, the Issuer shall at all times maintain a Calculation Agent; and
 - (iv) if and for so long as the Notes are admitted to listing, trading and/or quotation by any competent authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system which requires the appointment of a Paying Agent and/or a Transfer Agent in any particular place, the Issuer shall maintain a Paying Agent and/or a Transfer Agent having its Specified Office in the place required by such competent authority, stock exchange and/or quotation system.
- (f) Notice of any change in any of the Agents or in their Specified Offices shall promptly be given to the Noteholders.

16. Meetings of Noteholders; Modification and Waiver; Substitution

Meetings of Noteholders: The Trust Deed contains provisions for convening meetings of Noteholders to consider matters relating to the Notes, including the modification of any provision of these Conditions. Any such modification may be made if sanctioned by an Extraordinary Resolution. Such a meeting may be convened by the Issuer or by the Trustee and shall be convened by the Trustee upon the request in writing of Noteholders holding not less than one- tenth of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes. The quorum at any meeting convened to vote on an Extraordinary Resolution will be one or more Persons holding or representing one more than half of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes or, at any adjourned meeting, one or more Persons being or representing Noteholders whatever the principal amount of the Notes held or represented; provided, however, that Reserved Matters may only be sanctioned by an Extraordinary Resolution passed at a meeting of Noteholders at which one or more Persons holding or representing not less than three-quarters or, at any adjourned meeting, one quarter of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes form a quorum. Any Extraordinary Resolution duly passed at any such meeting shall be binding on all the Noteholders and Couponholders, whether present or not.

In addition, a resolution in writing signed by or on behalf of the holders of not less than 90 per cent. in nominal amount of the Notes which resolution of will take effect as if it were an Extraordinary Resolution. Such a resolution in writing may be contained in one document or several documents in the same form, each signed by or on behalf of one or more Noteholders.

(b) Modification and waiver: The Trustee and the Issuer may, without the consent of the

Noteholders, agree to any modification of the Notes, these Conditions, the Trust Deed or the Agency Agreement (other than in respect of a Reserved Matter) which is, in the opinion of the Trustee, proper to make if, in the opinion of the Trustee, such modification will not be materially prejudicial to the interests of Noteholders and to any modification of the Notes, these Conditions, the Trust Deed or the Agency Agreement which is of a formal, minor or technical nature or is to correct a manifest error.

In addition, the Trustee may, without the consent of the Noteholders or Couponholders, authorise or waive any proposed breach or breach of the Notes, these Conditions or the Trust Deed (other than a proposed breach or breach relating to the subject of a Reserved Matter) if, in the opinion of the Trustee, the interests of the Noteholders will not be materially prejudiced thereby.

Unless the Trustee agrees otherwise, any such authorisation, waiver or modification shall be notified to the Noteholders as soon as practicable thereafter. Any such authorisation, waiver or modification shall be binding on the Noteholders and the Couponholders.

(c) Substitution: The Trust Deed contains provisions under which the Trustee may, without the consent of the Noteholders, agree with the Issuer to the substitution in place of the Issuer (or of any previous substitute under this Condition) of any other company being a Subsidiary of the Issuer as the principal debtor under the Notes, the Coupons and the Trust Deed provided that certain conditions specified in the Trust Deed are fulfilled.

No Noteholder or Couponholder shall, in connection with any substitution, be entitled to claim any indemnification or payment in respect of any tax consequence thereof for such Noteholder or Couponholder, except to the extent provided for in Condition 11 (*Taxation*) (or any undertaking given in addition to or substitution for it pursuant to the provisions of the Trust Deed).

The Issuer shall procure that, so long as the Notes are admitted to trading on any exchange, any material amendments or modifications to the Conditions, the Trust Deed or such other conditions made pursuant to this Condition 16(c) (Substitution) shall be notified to such exchange.

17. Enforcement

- (a) The Trustee may at any time, at its discretion and without notice, institute such proceedings and/or steps or action (including lodging an appeal in any proceedings) as it thinks fit to enforce its rights under the Transaction Documents or the Notes or the Coupons and, at any time after the Security has become enforceable, the Trustee may at its discretion and without notice, take such steps, actions and proceedings as it may see fit to enforce the Security, but it shall not be bound to do so unless:
 - (i) it has been so requested in writing by the Holders of at least one quarter of the aggregate principal amount of the outstanding Notes or has been so directed by an Extraordinary Resolution; and
 - (ii) it has been indemnified and/or secured and/or pre-funded to its satisfaction.
- (b) No Noteholder or Couponholder may proceed directly against the Issuer unless the Trustee, having become bound to do so, fails to do so within a reasonable time and such failure is continuing.
- (c) The Trustee may refrain from taking any action in any jurisdiction if the taking of such

action in that jurisdiction would, in its opinion based upon legal advice in the relevant jurisdiction, be contrary to any law of that jurisdiction. Furthermore, the Trustee may also refrain from taking such action if it would otherwise render it liable to any person in that jurisdiction or if, in its opinion based upon such legal advice, it would not have the power to do the relevant thing in that jurisdiction by virtue of any applicable law in that jurisdiction or if it is determined by any court or other competent authority in that jurisdiction that it does not have such power.

18. Further Issues

The Issuer may from time to time, without the consent of the Noteholders or Couponholders and in accordance with the Trust Deed, create and issue further notes having the same terms and conditions as the Notes in all respects (or in all respects except for the first payment of interest) so as to form a single series with the Notes. The Issuer may from time to time, without the consent of the Noteholders or Couponholders, incur, create or issue further secured or unsecured notes or other Indebtedness.

19. Notices

- (a) Notices to the Holders of Notes shall be sent to them by first class mail (or its equivalent) or (if posted to an overseas address) by airmail at their respective addresses on the Register or, if such publication is not practicable, in a leading English language daily newspaper having general circulation in Europe. Any such notice shall be deemed to have been given on the fourth day after the date of mailing
- (b) The Issuer shall also ensure that notices are duly published in a manner which complies with the rules and regulations of any stock exchange or other relevant authority on which the Notes are for the time being listed or by which they have been admitted to trading.

20. Currency Indemnity

- (a) If any sum due from the Issuer in respect of the Notes or the Coupons or any order or judgment given or made in relation thereto has to be converted from the currency (the "first currency") in which the same is payable under these Conditions or such order or judgment into another currency (the "second currency") for the purpose of (a) making or filing a claim or proof against the Issuer, (b) obtaining an order or judgment in any court or other tribunal or (c) enforcing any order or judgment given or made in relation to the Notes, the Issuer shall indemnify each Noteholder, on the written demand of such Noteholder addressed to the Issuer and delivered to the Issuer or to the Specified Office of the Paying Agent, against any loss suffered as a result of any discrepancy between (i) the rate of exchange used for such purpose to convert the sum in question from the first currency into the second currency and (ii) the rate or rates of exchange at which such Noteholder may in the ordinary course of business purchase the first currency with the second currency upon receipt of a sum paid to it in satisfaction, in whole or in part, of any such order, judgment, claim or proof.
- (b) This indemnity constitutes a separate and independent obligation of the Issuer and shall give rise to a separate and independent cause of action.

21. Rounding

For the purposes of any calculations referred to in these Conditions (unless otherwise specified in these Conditions or the relevant Pricing Supplement), (a) all percentages resulting from such calculations will be rounded, if necessary, to the nearest one hundred-thousandth of a percentage point (with 0.000005 per cent. being rounded up to 0.00001

per cent.), (b) all U.S. dollar amounts used in or resulting from such calculations will be rounded to the nearest cent (with one half cent being rounded up), (c) all Japanese Yen amounts used in or resulting from such calculations will be rounded downwards to the next lower whole Japanese Yen amount, and (d) all amounts denominated in any other currency used in or resulting from such calculations will be rounded to the nearest two decimal places in such currency, with 0.005 being rounded upwards.

22. Governing Law and Jurisdiction

The Notes, the Coupons, the Trust Deed, the Agency Agreement and the Servicer Agreement and any non-contractual obligations arising out of or in connection with the Notes, the Trust Deed, the Agency Agreement and the Servicer Agreement are governed by, and construed in accordance with, English law. The courts of England are to have jurisdiction to settle any disputes that may arise out of or in connection with the Notes, the Coupons, the Trust Deed, the Agency Agreement and the Servicer Agreement and accordingly any legal action or proceedings arising out of or in connection with the Notes, the Coupons, the Trust Deed, the Agency Agreement and the Servicer Agreement ("Proceedings") may be brought in such courts. The Issuer irrevocably submits to the jurisdiction of such courts and waives any objections to Proceedings in such courts on the ground of venue or on the ground that the Proceedings have been brought in an inconvenient forum. This submission is for the benefit of each of the Trustee, the Noteholders and Couponholders and shall not limit the right of any of them to take Proceedings in any other court of competent jurisdiction nor shall the taking of Proceedings in any one or more jurisdictions preclude the taking of Proceedings in any other jurisdiction (whether concurrently or not).

23. Limited Recourse and Non-Petition

- (a) All payments to be made by the Issuer in respect of the Notes of a particular Series will be made in accordance with these Conditions and only from and to the extent of the sums received or recovered from time to time by or on behalf of the Issuer, and which are attributable to the relevant Series, up to the date falling 180 days after the Maturity Date (the "Longstop Maturity Date").
- (b) In relation to any sums received or recovered, the Issuer shall determine to which Series such sums relate and such determination shall be binding on Noteholders of all Series in the absence of manifest error.
- (c) In the event that the Issuer is unable to make or, following a request by the Trustee fails to make, the determination in Condition 23(b), such determination may be made by the Trustee or by such person as is directed by the Trustee. No liability shall attach to the Trustee as a result of such determination.
- (d) To the extent that the sums referred to in Condition 23(a) are less than the amount which the Noteholders may have expected to receive (the difference being referred to as the "Shortfall"), such Shortfall will be borne by the Noteholders following the Longstop Maturity Date.
- (e) Each Noteholder, by subscribing for and purchasing Notes, will be deemed to accept and acknowledge that it is fully aware that:
 - the Noteholders shall look solely to the sums referred to in this Condition 23 as applied in accordance with the above paragraphs (the "Relevant Sums"), for payments to be made by the Issuer in respect of the Notes;
 - (ii) the Noteholders of any Series shall not look to the sums which are attributable to another Series in satisfaction of the obligations of the Issuer;

- (iii) the obligations of the Issuer to make payments in respect of the Notes will be limited to the Relevant Sums and the Noteholders shall have no further recourse to the Issuer or its shareholders, directors, officers, successors or assigns in respect of the Notes;
- (iv) without prejudice to the foregoing, any right of the Noteholders to claim payment of any amount exceeding the Relevant Sums shall be automatically extinguished on the Longstop Maturity Date; and
- (v) the Noteholders shall not be able to petition for the winding up of the Issuer as a consequence of any Shortfall.
- (f) Non-payment of any interest prior to the Maturity Date shall not constitute an Event of Default under Condition 12 (Events of Default) and any interest so not paid shall continue to be payable in accordance with Conditions 6 and 7 but without accruing any further interest on such unpaid amounts.
- (g) None of the Trustee and the Agents has any obligation to any Noteholder for payment of any amount by the Issuer in respect of the Notes.

CREST DEPOSITORY INTERESTS

CREST Depository Interests are independent securities distinct from the Notes, constituted under, and governed by, English law and transferred through CREST and will be issued by CREST Depository Limited (the "CREST Depository") pursuant to the global deed poll dated 25 June 2001 (as subsequently modified, supplemented and/or restated) (the "CREST Deed Poll").

The CDIs will represent indirect interests in the interest of CREST International Nominees Limited (the "CREST Nominee") in the Underlying Notes. Pursuant to the CREST Manual (as defined below), Notes held in global form by the common depositary or common safekeeper may be settled through CREST, and the CREST Depository will issue CDIs. The CDIs will be independent securities distinct from the Notes, constituted under English law, and may be held and transferred through CREST.

Interests in the Underlying Notes will be credited to the CREST Nominee's account with a Relevant Clearing System and the CREST Nominee will hold such interests as nominee for the CREST Depository which will issue CDIs to the relevant CREST participants.

Each CDI will be treated by the CREST Depository as if it were one Underlying Note, for the purposes of determining all rights and obligations and all amounts payable in respect thereof. The CREST Depository will pass on to holders of CDIs ("CDI Holders") any interest or other amounts received by it as holder of the Underlying Notes on trust for such CDI Holders. These will include the fees and expenses charged by the CREST Depository in respect of the provision of services by it under the CREST Deed Poll and any taxes, duties, charges, costs or expenses which may be or become payable in connection with the holding of the Notes through the CREST International Settlement Links Service.

TAXATION

The following is a general description of certain United Kingdom and European tax considerations relating to the Notes. It does not purport to be a complete analysis of all tax considerations relating to the Notes, whether in those countries or elsewhere. Prospective purchasers of Notes should consult their own tax advisers as to which countries' tax laws could be relevant to acquiring, holding and disposing of Notes and receiving payments of interest, principal and/or other amounts under the Notes and the consequences of such actions under the tax laws of those countries. This summary is based upon the law as in effect on the date of this Listing Particulars and is subject to any change in law that may take effect after such date.

UNITED KINGDOM

The following applies only to persons who are the beneficial owners of Notes and is a summary of the Issuer's understanding of current United Kingdom law and published HM Revenue and Customs ("HMRC") practice in the United Kingdom relating only to United Kingdom withholding tax treatment of payments of principal and interest in respect of Notes. It does not deal with any other United Kingdom taxation implications of acquiring, holding or disposing of Notes. The United Kingdom tax treatment of prospective Noteholders depends on their individual circumstances and may be subject to change in the future (possibly with retroactive effect). Prospective Noteholders who may be subject to tax in a jurisdiction other than the United Kingdom or who may be unsure as to their tax position should seek their own professional advice.

Interest on the Notes

Payments of interest on the Notes may be made without deduction of or withholding on account of United Kingdom income tax provided that the Notes are and continue to be listed on a "recognised stock exchange" within the meaning of section 1005 of the Income Tax Act 2007 or admitted to trading on a "multilateral trading facility" operated by an "EEA-regulated recognised stock exchange" within the meaning of section 987 of the Income Tax Act 2007. Börse Frankfurt of Frankfurt Stock Exchange is a recognised stock exchange and securities listed on Börse Frankfurt of Frankfurt Stock Exchange are designated by the HMRC to be listed on a recognised stock exchange. Notes will be treated as listed on Eurnoext Dublin if they are included in the Official List and admitted to trading.

Notes to be traded on any other recognised stock exchange will be treated as listed on a recognised stock exchange if (and only if) they are admitted to trading on that exchange and they are officially listed, in accordance with provisions corresponding to those generally applicable in European Economic Area states, in a country outside the United Kingdom in which there is a recognised stock exchange. Provided, therefore, that the Notes remain listed on a recognised stock exchange or admitted to trading on a multilateral trading facility operated by an EEA-regulated recognised stock exchange, interest on the Notes will be payable without withholding or deduction on account of United Kingdom tax.

Interest on the Notes may also be paid without deduction of or withholding on account of United Kingdom tax where, at the time the payment of interest is made, the Issuer reasonably believes (and any person by or through whom interest on the Notes is paid reasonably believes) that the beneficial owner of the interest is within the charge to United Kingdom corporation tax as regards the payment of interest; provided that HMRC has not given a direction (in circumstances where it has reasonable grounds to believe that the above exemption is not available in respect of such payment of interest at the time the payment is made) that the interest should be paid under deduction of tax.

Interest on the Notes may also be paid without deduction of or withholding on account of United Kingdom tax where the maturity of the Notes is less than 365 days from the date of issue and those Notes do not form part of a scheme or arrangement of borrowing intended to be capable of

remaining outstanding for more than 364 days.

In other cases, an amount must generally be withheld from payments of interest on the Notes on account of United Kingdom income tax at the basic rate (currently 20 per cent.). However, where an applicable double tax treaty provides for a lower rate of withholding tax (or for no tax to be withheld) in relation to a Noteholder, HMRC can issue a notice to the Issuer to pay interest to the Noteholder without deduction of tax (or for interest to be paid with tax deducted at the rate provided for in the relevant double tax treaty).

Other Rules Relating to United Kingdom Withholding Tax

Notes may be issued at an issue price of less than 100 per cent. of their principal amount. Any discount element on any such Notes should not be subject to any United Kingdom withholding tax pursuant to the provisions mentioned in the paragraph headed "Interest on Notes" above, but may be subject to reporting requirements as outlined under the paragraphs headed "Provision of Information" below.

Where interest has been paid under deduction of United Kingdom income tax, Noteholders who are not resident in the United Kingdom for United Kingdom tax purposes may be able to recover all or part of the tax deducted subject to an appropriate provision in any applicable double taxation treaty and the laws of the jurisdiction in which the Noteholder is resident for tax purposes.

The references to "interest" above mean "interest" as understood in United Kingdom tax law. The statements above do not take any account of any different definitions of "interest" or "principal" which may prevail under any other law or which may be created by the Terms and Conditions of the Notes or any related documentation. Noteholders should seek their own professional advice as regards the withholding tax treatment of any payment on the Notes which does not constitute "interest" or "principal" as those terms are understood in United Kingdom tax law.

Further United Kingdom income tax issues

Interest, discount and premium on the Notes may be subject to United Kingdom income tax or corporation tax by direct assessment even where paid without deduction or withholding for on account of United Kingdom income tax.

However, interest, discount and premium which is properly received without deduction or withholding for or on account of United Kingdom income tax will not be chargeable to United Kingdom tax in the hands of a Noteholder (other than certain trustees) who is not resident for tax purposes in the United Kingdom unless that Noteholder (i) carries on a trade, profession or vocation in the United Kingdom through a United Kingdom branch or agency or (ii) is a company carrying on a trade in the United Kingdom through a permanent establishment, in connection with which the interest, discount or premium is received or to which the Notes are attributable. In such a case, United Kingdom income tax or corporation tax may be levied on the branch, agency or permanent establishment, although there are exceptions for certain types of agent (such as some brokers and investment managers). The provisions of any applicable double tax treaty may be relevant to such a Noteholder.

Where interest or premium on the Notes has been paid under deduction of United Kingdom income tax, Noteholders who are not resident in the United Kingdom for United Kingdom tax purposes may be able to recover all or part of the tax deducted or withheld for, or on account of, United Kingdom income tax, subject to an appropriate provision in any applicable double taxation treaty and the laws of the jurisdiction in which the Noteholder is resident for tax purposes.

Provision of Information

Noteholders should note that, in certain circumstances, HMRC has power to obtain information (including the name and address of the beneficial owner of the interest) from any person in the

United Kingdom who either pays or credits interest to or receives interest for the benefit of a Noteholder. In certain circumstances, the information so obtained may be passed by HMRC to the tax authorities of certain other jurisdictions.

The provisions referred to above may also apply, in certain circumstances, to payments made on redemption of any Notes which constitute "deeply discounted securities" for the purposes of section 430 of the Income Tax (Trading and Other Income) Act 2005 (although, in this regard, HMRC published guidance for the year 2016/2017, updated as at March 2020 indicates that HMRC will not exercise its power to obtain information in relation to such payments in that year).

FOREIGN ACCOUNT TAX COMPLIANCE ACT

United States Tax Compliance Act The following overview of FATCA (as defined below) is for general information purposes only. U.S. tax rules known as the Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act ("FATCA") could impose a withholding tax of 30 per cent. on payments on the Secured Notes paid to a Noteholder or any non-U.S. person or entity that receives such income (a "non-U.S. payee") on a Noteholder's behalf, unless the Noteholder and each non-U.S. payee in the payment chain comply with the applicable information reporting, account identification, withholding, certification and other FATCA-related requirements. This withholding tax will generally not apply unless the Secured Notes are treated as giving rise to "foreign passthru payments" and are issued after the date that is six months after the U.S. Treasury Department issues final regulations defining what constitutes "foreign passthru payments" (provided that the terms of the Secured Notes are not modified after that date in a way that would cause the Secured Notes to be treated as reissued for U.S. tax purposes). There are currently no rules regarding what constitutes a "foreign passthru payment" or when the defining regulations would be issued.

Even if this withholding tax were to apply to payments on the Secured Notes, in the case of a payee that is a non-U.S. financial institution (for example, a clearing system, custodian, nominee or broker), withholding generally will not be imposed if the financial institution complies with the requirements imposed by FATCA to collect and report (to the U.S. or another relevant taxing authority) substantial information regarding such institution's U.S. account holders (which would include some account holders that are non-U.S. entities but have U.S. owners). Other payees, including individuals, may be required to provide proof of tax residence or waivers of confidentiality laws and/or, in the case of non U.S. entities, certification or information relating to their U.S. ownership. Under this withholding regime, withholding may be imposed at any point in a chain of payments if the payee is not compliant. A chain may work as follows, for example: The payment is transferred through a Principal Paying Agent to a clearing system, the clearing system makes a payment to each of the clearing system's participants, and finally the clearing system participant makes a payment to a non-U.S. bank or broker through which a Noteholder holds the Secured Notes, who credits the payment to the Noteholder's account. Accordingly, if a Noteholder receives payments through a chain that includes one or more non-U.S. payees, such as a non-U.S. bank or broker, the payment could be subject to withholding if, for example, the Noteholder's non-U.S. bank or broker through which the Noteholder holds the Secured Notes fails to comply with the FATCA requirements and is subject to withholding. This would be the case even if a Noteholder would not otherwise have been directly subject to withholding.

A number of countries have entered into, and other countries are expected to enter into, agreements with the U.S. to facilitate the type of information reporting required under FATCA. While the existence of such agreements will not eliminate the risk that the Secured Notes will be subject to the withholding described above, these agreements are expected to reduce the risk of the withholding for investors in (or investors that indirectly hold Secured Notes through financial institutions in) those countries. The U.S. has entered into such agreements with the United Kingdom. Under these agreements, a financial institution that is resident in the United Kingdom and meets the requirements of the agreement will not be subject to the withholding described

above on payments it receives and generally will not be required to withhold from non-U.S. source income payments that it makes, including payments on the Secured Notes.

The Issuer will not pay any additional amounts in respect of this withholding tax, so if this withholding applies, a Noteholder will receive less than the amount that it would have otherwise received.

Depending on a Noteholder's circumstances, in the event the Issuer is required to withhold any amounts in respect of this withholding tax, the Noteholder may be entitled to a refund or credit in respect of some or all of this withholding. However, even if the Noteholder is entitled to have any such withholding refunded, the required procedures could be cumbersome and significantly delay the Noteholder's receipt of any withheld amounts.

FATCA is particularly complex and prospective investors should consult their tax advisers on how these rules may apply to payments they receive in connection with the Notes.

THE PROPOSED FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS TAX

The European Commission has published a proposal for a Directive for a common financial transaction tax ("FTT") in certain participating Member States.

The Commission's Proposal has very broad scope and could, if introduced, apply to certain dealings in the Notes (including secondary market transactions) in certain circumstances. Under the Commission's Proposal the FTT could apply in certain circumstances to persons both within and outside of the participating Member States. Generally, it would apply to certain dealings in the Notes where at least one party is a financial institution, and at least one party is established in a participating Member State. A financial institution may be, or be deemed to be, "established" in a participating Member State in a broad range of circumstances, including (a) by transacting with a person established in a participating Member State or (b) where the financial instrument which is subject to the dealings is issued in a participating Member State.

However, the FTT proposal remains subject to negotiation between participating Member States. It may therefore be altered prior to any implementation, the timing of which remains unclear. Additional EU Member States may decide to participate.

Prospective holders of the Notes are advised to seek their own professional advice in relation to the FTT.

SUBSCRIPTION AND SALE

All Notes will initially be sold to Avenir Registrars Limited as the settlement agent (the "Settlement Agent") and may be resold at prevailing market prices, or at prices related thereto, at the time of such resale, as determined by the Settlement Agent. Potential investors in the Notes must apply directly to the Settlement Agent through a broker or other custodian or intermediary via the appropriate clearing system (see the section "Book-Entry Clearing Systems"). Applications may not be made directly to the Issuer. Details of the Settlement Agent are set out in the applicable Pricing Supplement.

Notes may be offered for sale from time to time by any entity appointed as a promoter (the "**Promoters**") and listed as such in the applicable Pricing Supplement.

The Issuer has the power to appoint additional Promoters from time to time, provided the Issuer makes a Regulatory News Services announcement on the London Stock Exchange.

United States of America: Regulation S Category; TEFRA D or TEFRA C as specified in the relevant Pricing Supplement or neither if TEFRA is specified as not applicable in the relevant Pricing Supplement.

The Notes have not been and will not be registered under the Securities Act and may not be offered or sold within the United States or to, or for the account or benefit of, U.S. persons except in certain transactions exempt from the registration requirements of the Securities Act. Terms used in this paragraph have the meanings given to them by Regulation S.

Each Promoter and Settlement Agent has agreed that it will not offer, sell or deliver Notes, (i) as part of their distribution at any time or (ii) otherwise until 40 days after the completion of the distribution of the Notes comprising the relevant Tranche, as certified to the Paying Agent or the Issuer by such Promoter or the Settlement Agent (or, in the case of a sale of a Tranche of Notes to or through more than one Promoter, by each of such Promoters as to the Notes of such Tranche offered by or through it, in which case the Paying Agent or the Issuer shall notify each such Promoter when all such Promoters have so certified) within the United States or to, or for the account or benefit of, U.S. persons, and the Settlement Agent or such Promoter will have sent to each entity to which it sells Notes during the distribution compliance period relating thereto a confirmation or other notice setting forth the restrictions on offers and sales of the Notes within the United States or to, or for the account or benefit of, U.S. persons.

In addition, until 40 days after the commencement of the offering of Notes comprising any Tranche, any offer or sale of Notes within the United States by any entity (whether or not participating in the offering) may violate the registration requirements of the Securities Act.

(a) PROHIBITION OF SALES TO EEA RETAIL INVESTORS

Each Promoter and the Settlement Agent has represented and agreed, and each further Promoter appointed under the Programme will be required to represent and agree, that it has not offered, sold or otherwise made available and will not offer, sell or otherwise make available any Notes which are the subject of the offering contemplated by this Listing Particulars as completed by the Pricing Supplement in relation thereto (or are the subject of the offering contemplated by a Drawdown Particulars, as the case may be) to any retail investor in the European Economic Area. For the purposes of this provision:

- (a) the expression "retail investor" means a person who is one (or more) of the following:
 - (i) a retail client as defined in point (11) of Article 4(1) of Directive 2014/65/EU (as amended, "MiFID II"); or
 - (ii) a customer within the meaning of Directive 2016/97/EU (the "Insurance

- Distribution Directive"), where that customer would not qualify as a professional client as defined in point (10) of Article 4(1) of MiFID II; or
- (iii) not a qualified investor as defined in Regulation (EU) 2017/1129 (the "Prospectus Regulation"); and

the expression "offer" includes the communication in any form and by any means of sufficient information on the terms of the offer and the Notes to be offered so as to enable an investor to decide to purchase or subscribe for the Notes.

UNITED KINGDOM

Each Promoter and the Settlement Agent has represented, warranted and agreed that:

- 1. **No deposit-taking:** in relation to any Notes having a maturity of less than one year:
 - a. it is a person whose ordinary activities involve it in acquiring, holding, managing or disposing of investments (as principal or agent) for the purposes of its business; and:
 - b. it has not offered or sold and will not offer or sell any Notes other than to persons:

GENERAL

Each Promoter and the Settlement Agent has represented, warranted and agreed that (to the best of its knowledge and belief) it has complied and will comply with all applicable laws and regulations in each country or jurisdiction in or from which it purchases, offers, sells or delivers Notes or possesses, distributes or publishes this Listing Particulars or any Pricing Supplement or any related offering material, in all cases at its own expense. Other persons into whose hands this Listing Particulars or any Pricing Supplement comes are required by the Issuer and the Settlement Agent to comply with all applicable laws and regulations in each country or jurisdiction in or from which they purchase, offer, sell or deliver Notes or possess, distribute or publish this Listing Particulars or any Pricing Supplement or any related offering material, in all cases at their own expense.

Selling restrictions may be supplemented or modified with the agreement of the Issuer. Any such supplement or modification may be set out in the relevant Pricing Supplement or in a supplement to this Listing Particulars.

POTENTIAL INVESTORS

Potential investors will be required to confirm that they are: (a) persons who have professional
